For his undergraduate he attended John Carroll University in University Heights, Ohio, then got his masters in Educational Leadership at the University of Dayton and took some additional classes through Miami University to get his certificate to be a principal. He is very interested in what we do and he loves to go to extracurricular activities. Right now he feels like we think of him as an outsider who is learning and over time he will be more and more involved.

If you are looking for the thrillest and scariest rides at Cedar Point the top 3 are the Maverick, Millennium Force, and the Top Thrill Dragster. The Maverick is a 70 mph roller coaster that is 105 feet tall. Next up is the Millenium Force, this roller coaster goes 93 mph and sits at 310 feet tall. The drop makes me wanna pee myself sometimes, I swear it's like you're going straight to your death. And lastly is the Top Thrill Dragster, which towers at 420 feet tall and goes 120 mph. I have always wanted to go on this ride, but it was always closed that tells you something- or my friends wimped out on me. The lines to these rides were always crazy long, so I recommend buying any of the fast lane passes. If you want to ride all these rides with little to no wait. Cedar Point in my opinion is very fun.
