

New Subdivision Planned For Surf City To Connect To Hwy 17

In May, a public forum was held by the developers of Applewood Trace, an extension of the Turtle Creek Subdivision. The informal meeting was offered beneath a tent in the Surf City Elementary School parking lot for anyone who wanted to learn about the possible growth planned.

Turtle Creek Ventures, LLC purchased the property in March of 2022.

One of the first questions asked was regarding the sewer that would be required for such a large development. Currently the Town of Surf City is only offering sewer to previous applicants

and new applicants are being told a wait of 3-5 years could be possible.

The representatives on site pointed out that this development would have its own sewer facility for the projects listed and would be offering a sewer main (not hook ups) to 35 adjacent property owners in lieu of access through Edgecomb Drive and Manhollow Church Road. This access would offer the residents a second form of egress and ingress and would connect them to Highway 17.

Another feature in the works of the current planned development was to


offer a walking/bike path to the elementary school for students and

When this development was first designed, it included direct access to highway 17, but during the discussion the representatives stated that due to wetlands, the highway 17 property would not be accessible for the residents of the subdivision and that it most likely would be sold.

Residents of Turkey Creek that came to the forum were concerned about the amount of traffic an additional 714 residential units would create. The plan

calls for 100 single family homes, 314 rental units and 300 multi-family homes. The total project is 99.70 acres which averages out to 7 units per acre.

Sea Turtle Hospital News

Tuesday June 14th was homecoming, or more accurately, home-going for ten rehabilitated sea turtles: one loggerhead, two Kemp's and seven greens. Nine of these critters were victims of cold stunning, Kemp's "Magic Potion" being the exception. His decision to choose a quick snack on a baited hook landed him in our hospital for a month.

This was our first public release for the year and sea turtles can certainly draw a crowd. Despite the forecast for extreme heat and humidity it looked like more than one-thousand people managed to make their way to the beach and hang in there until the last turtle powered through the surf.

The smaller turtles were brought down to the shoreline in their transport tubs and then carried by our volunteers slowly up and down the exceptionally long lines seeming to enjoy the oohs and ahhs of their adoring fans and striking poses for photo ops. We've learned over the years that some of them are just hams when they see a camera. "Sea Glass", one of the larger juvenile greens, got a ride strapped down on our special "turtle taxi" because she's, well, kinda crazy. Our larger turtle taxi hauled loggerhead "Burnt Sienna" who tipped the scales close to one-hundred-twenty pounds down to the surf. Once they hit the water only a sandbar close to shore

slowed them down, for just a few seconds. They were gone with barely a wave of and flipper for a final goodbye. Even though ten turtles have left the building there are still patients who are waiting for you to visit, including permanent resident and hospital ambassador "Lennie" and crowd favorite Jersey girl "Snooki." Our senior interns are giving our regular staff a bit of a break for summer and are very enthusiastic about their twelve weeks with us. You'll be meeting most of them during your visit and we "regulars" always hope our guests can come up with a question or two that makes them do some research or must ask one of us old-timers for help in answering. We've added another hour to our tours Monday - Friday to accommodate the overwhelming request for tickets. New tour hours for Mon-Fri are Noon - 4 PM through July.

Brown Pelican

Pelicans are much more together, I'd say-Never would you find a pelican begging for food or making a show of it if they didn't get what they wanted.

The brown pelican is the one that graces our shores. It has the distinctive pouch where he stores food and has a huge wingspan of over six feet.

Watching the pelican soar and glide, I'm often reminded of the scene from the movie Jurassic Park where they glide

through the air with the actors flying in a plane alongside them.

Most pelicans migrate south for the winter but there is a small amount who remain year round. They are fairly safe here though since we rarely have cold snaps so severe to plunge below 30 degrees for long periods of time. Unfortunately, if caught in a cold snap, pelicans can get frostbite and possibly lose a pouch or their webbed feet.

I don't see them very often in the winter time, but they do stay late into the fall. As for their nesting habits, pelicans choose flat nest sites on gravel, sand or soil near other pelicans who are at the same stage of the breeding cycle. Mostly or about half of our state's brown pelican population nests on Audubon's Islandsares that are designated and critical to their survival.

So much for the brown pelican, our much enjoyed local bird. Long may you fly. Long may you bring us your grace and beauty.

Holly Ridge Police Department's K9 Razmus To Get Donation Of Body Armor


Holly Ridge Police Department's K9 Razmus will receive a bullet and stab protective vest thanks to a charitable donation from non-profit organization Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. K9 Razmus' vest will be embroidered with the sentiment "This gift of protection provided by Vested Interest in K9s, Inc.". Delivery is expected within eight to ten weeks.

Vested Interest in K9s, Inc., established in 2009, is a 501(c)(3) charity whose mission is to provide bullet and stab protective vests and other assistance to dogs of law enforcement and related agencies throughout the United States. This potentially lifesaving body armor for four-legged K9 officers is U.S. made, custom fitted, and NIJ certified. Since its inception, Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. has provided over 4,682 vests to K9s in all 50 states at a value of \$6.9 million, made possible by both private and corporate donations.

The program is open to U.S. dogs that are at least 20 months old and actively employed and certified with law enforcement or related agencies. K9s with expired vests are also eligible to participate.

There are an estimated 30,000 law enforcement K9s throughout the United States.

Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. accepts tax-deductible contributions in any amount, while a single donation of \$960 will sponsor one vest. One Life, Training To Save Another

When a call for help is received, volunteers travel throughout North Carolina or other states to assist in the request. With the search, the air scent dog is full of energy and is trained to search an area to detect a missing person. When the person they are searching for is found, they run back to their owner behind them on the trail. jumping, barking, and pacing....come on, hurry up, they are saying. Follow me, I found them!!!! Trailing dogs will use a scent article of the person they are looking for and follow the trail of the missing person until they find the person or lose the trail.

There is a different tone, however, when HRD (Human Remains Detection) is the reason the search is occurring. The dogs have a serious tone about them, they are subdued and intensely focused. When detection is made, the dog will provide their trained response to the find. Typically, they sit or down at the source, but if they find the source far away from their handler, they will return to the handler and show them where the source is.

Meet your Neighbors...... Marci and Brian Anderson volunteer as team members of the Brunswick Search & Rescue (BSAR) along with their K9s, Lucy & Champ. They have rigorous compass navigation training and are certified in finding missing persons in all types of environments, such as disaster, water recovery, woods, and urban situations in North & South Carolina. Their mission is to find people they have never met, utilizing their dogs to find lost or missing persons. BSAR K9's are certified in wilderness air scent, man trailing, and human remains detection on both land and in water.

BSAR responds to missing person incidents upon the request of local law enforcement, emergency managers, or state/national agencies. Presentations are also available to organizations about Search & Rescue and children's programs regarding "How Not to Get Lost in the Woods and What to Do If You Get Lost." BSAR is a non-profit organization that raises funds to support the training of our volunteers and K9s, and cover search

expenses. Tax-deductible donations are always welcome, along with volunteers to assist in their training efforts. Don't hesitate to contact ocpaw.com if you would like a representative to contact you regarding these programs.



Know NC Gun Laws and Rules

1. A person must be 18 years of age to purchase a long gun that includes rifles and shotguns. A photo ID and a background check is required by any NC gun shop before transferring this weapon to a buyer. If a person is 21 or older, and has a NC Conceal & Carry permit, then no additional background check is required.

- 2. A person must be 21 years of age or older to purchase a handgun. In order to purchase a handgun, the NC resident must have a photo ID and a NC Purchase Permit or NC Conceal Carry permit.
- 3. A person who holds a Conceal & Carry permit from another state may legally carry concealed in NC but cannot purchase and leave with the handgun in NC.
- 4. A person who is 18 through 20 years of age may obtain a purchase permit from their sheriff's office to purchase or receive a handgun from a private person such as a family member. These permits are not valid to purchase from a licensed FFL gun dealer.
- 5. A person on vacation may purchase a handgun and it will be shipped to a gun dealer in their state for pickup.
- 6. Any person may ship a firearm as long as a copy of their photo ID is included in the box and it MUST be received by an FFL. It is against the law in all states to ship firearms to a private person.
- 7. Both a NC purchase permit and conceal carry permit are good for 5 years. A conceal carry permit is renewed every 5 years for a fee. If the conceal carry has not expired, no additional classes are required.
- 8. A NC purchase permit can not exceed 5 dollars in cost and there is no limit to the number of permits a person can get.
- 9. Before travelling out of state with a firearm, make sure you know every state's laws that you will travel through. Call local gun shops in those states.
- 10. Firearms must be locked and out of reach of children and any one who is not allowed to access them.
- 11. 99% of all firearms are semi-automatic which means one pull of a trigger per bullet.
- 12. Full auto weapons require extensive paperwork, fees and background checks. Full auto weapons are very expensive.
- 13. It is legal to hunt in Pender County with a suppressed firearm.
- 14. A silencer or suppresser does not make the gun 100% quiet but does dampen the noise.
- 15. A person may not fire a firearm within city limits and should check with their local county for firearm regulations.

Ten Rules of Safe Gun Handling

- 1. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction and away from people. Never point your gun at anything you don't intend to shoot.
- 2. Firearms should be unloaded when not in use. Always make sure the magazine is out of the gun and no live round is in the chamber.
- 3. Don't rely on your gun's "safety". Always treat a gun as if it could fire at anytime.
- 4. Be sure of your target and what is beyond it. A pile of dirt or clay will not let a bullet travel through. A wooden target will not stop a bullet.
- 5. Use correct ammunition. Avoid reloaded ammo unless you personally know where it came from and trust that person.
- 6. If your gun fails to fire when the trigger is pulled, handle with great care! Keep gun pointed at a safe direction and unload firearm.
- 7. Always wear eye and ear protection when shooting.
- 8. Be sure the barrel is clear of obstructions before shooting.
- 9. Clean your gun and inspect it regularly.





Grandma's Famous Salmon Cakes



1 (14.75 ounce) can salmon, drained and flaked 2 large eggs, beaten 1 small onion, diced

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

3 tablespoons vegetable oil

Pick through salmon to remove any bones or large pieces of skin. Beat eggs in a mixing bowl. Stir in salmon, onion, and black pepper. Mix thoroughly. Shape salmon mixture into eight 2-ounce patties. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Fry patties until crispy and golden brown on the outsides, about 5 minutes per side; work in batches if necessary to avoid crowding the pan.

Banana and Vanilla Cupcakes with Buttercream Frosting



1-3/4 cups all-purpose flour 2 teaspoons baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup butter, at room temperature

1/2 cup white sugar 3 eggs, room temperature 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/4 cup milk 2 large bananas, chopped Buttercream Frosting:

2/3 cup butter, at room temperature

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract 2-1/4 cups confectioners' sugar

2 tablespoons heavy cream 4 drops yellow food coloring, or

as desired

Preheat an oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease 12 muffin cups or line with paper muffin liners. Whisk the flour, baking powder, and salt together in a bowl; set aside. Beat 1/2 cup butter and the white sugar with an electric mixer in a large bowl until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time, allowing each to blend into the butter mixture before adding the next. Beat in the vanilla with the last egg. Pour in the flour mixture alternately with the milk, mixing until just incorporated. Fold in the chopped bananas, mixing just enough to evenly combine. Pour the batter into prepared cups. Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 20 minutes. Cool in the pans for 10 minutes before removing to cool completely on a wire rack. While the cupcakes are cooling, make the buttercream by beating 2/3 cup of butter in a bowl until smooth and glossy. Beat in the vanilla, followed by the confectioners' sugar. Once no dry lumps of sugar remain, add the cream and food coloring. Whip on high speed until light and fluffy. Frost the cooled cupcakes with the buttercream frosting.




