for Sheets King begin their epic journey to the mission field.

It's taken years of dedication, sacrifice, and no small amount of prayer, and now, finally, Jason and Sarah Sheets and their three children have made their epic move to Costa Rica for language school and then soon to Peru for fulltime service in Christian Missions, I have known the Sheets for just over 14 years, having met both of them at Western Baptist College (now Corban University). However, you only really need to know them for about five minutes before you will discover their hearts for Jesus Christ and for Christian Missions. In fact, very early in their relationship, Sarah informed Jason, "I'm going to be a missionary." To which he replied, "I'm good with that."

In 2012, that vision became a reality when the Sheets were accepted as missionary candidates with The Evangelical Alliance Mission (TEAM). Originally founded over 120 years ago, TEAM currently has over 550 missionary units on 5 continents, in over 35 countries. The Sheets will be serving in Arequipa, Peru, and in the nearby village of Ciudad de Dios, working specifically in the church planting process. When asked why they had chosen Peru, Sarah replied with a laugh, "Because TEAM needed us there!"

There was, of course, more to it than that. The Sheets have always had a heart for Latin American cultures; they have even served in a Latin American church in their home city of Salem, Oregon. It wasn't that much of a stretch to see themselves serving in an actual Latin American country, and so when God called them to Peru, they were faithful

Patience and faith were required in great measure over the next few years as the family worked to raise support and prepare for their ministry. Though the Sheets had originally planned to head directly to Peru from Oregon, a change in Visa regulations did not permit this. However, God was not about to leave these two faithful servants on the sidelines, and so the decision was made that the Sheets family would spend their first year of international ministry in San Jose, Costa Rica studying Spanish at Instituto de Lengua Española.

Now, at the time of this publication, the Sheets are more than three months into their studies. There is no doubt that acclimating to a new language and culture has been intense, but Jason and Sarah are both up to the challenge. As Sarah shared in a recent blog post, "...we had meetings with professors to evaluate our midtrimester progress. How in the world did time fly so quickly? With all the normal everyday happenings PLUS classes and afterschool activities time surely has gone quickly! People ask if we are absolutely LOVING everything about being here in Costa Rica and while we can mostly say yes, there are a

few things which we miss about Salem: mainly our family, friends, and church! The kids miss their school and friends there too! However, all in all, we are doing very well."

He LOVES going to class with Lizbet every morning while Jason and I attend classes. Some fellow students don't believe us when we say he gets fussy occasionally!



I am personally very excited to see what Christ is going to do for His glory in the ministry of the Sheets family in the years to come. When they arrive in Areguipa, their work will include primarily outreach and church planting. As Jason explained, "El Camino (a TEÂM church plant) has begun

ministry in the poor community of Ciudad de Dios - "City of God" - located just outside of the city. It is a spiritually dark and needy part of the Peruvian where tradition Andes, mountain isolation have evangelism a difficult and lengthy task. When first planted 13 years ago, El Camino laid out the goal of multiplying itself and planting a daughter church. Peruvian members of the church have been serving in Ciudad de Dios twice a month for the past few years. They are establishing relationships with the people, openly sharing the Gospel and studying Scripture, and teaching much needed job skills. They are laying the ground work for a church plant in a community that has no evangelical church. We get the privilege of assisting the El Camino church in doing this community development and church planting work."

As always the Sheets family remains in my prayers, and I will be following the progress of Christ's ministry through them closely. [I even get to visit them in the field next Thanksgiving!] The Sheets ask for your support in the following ways:

New Educational Ministry Changes lives in the Philippines.

It was June 2010. I will never forget that summer. It was the summer where God put my faith to the extreme test as I ventured out of the country on my very first international mission trip. My destination was Nueva Santa Rosa, Guatemala where my team and I would be helping to build houses and working in local churches. I can scarcely recall a week in my life where I got to see God work so powerfully, though I am sure He has; I just remember this week very vividly.

A hurricane, an earthquake, a sink hole, and an erupting volcano all occurred within days of our leaving on the trip, and for a while I considered withdrawing from the team altogether. However, Christ quickly reminded me of Hebrews 11:6, "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a

years, home never really leaves your heart, and Gina has been blessed with the chance to visit her mother country several times over the years. Even so, during 2012, God had something far more than a visit in mind.

It can often be hard to imagine, but simple skills like knowing how to read and write are not always common place in developing nations. During 2012, Gina was touched by the earnest desire of many of the children in the Philippines to learn how to read, but she was concerned about the lack of resources to do so. So, beginning in February 2012 with six eager students in Isabel, Leyte, Philippines, the foundation for what would become Lantaw-Ugma Outreach was set.

The name literally means "Looking into a Bright Future" in Gina's native dialect. As she explained in a later newsletter, "LUO's desire is to continue to encourage the kids not to lose hope. We're helping them acquire education by supporting their school needs. Our prayer is that no matter what their economic situation and circumstance at home, these kids would be able to get an education." And, of course, the mission is also much deeper. As servants of Christ, the Browns hope to see each and every child who passes through LUO develop a personal relationship with their Savior.

It has now been over two since Lantaw-Ugma years officially started in January 2013. In that time, the program has grown to the ability to provide meals, school supplies, and tutorial assistance to nearly 60 children. In addition to basic educational skills, the children are taught God's Word through daily Bible lessons, songs, prayer, and games. As was shared on the LUO Facebook page, "We are convinced that at this formative time of their childhood years, the hope of Christ is their best tool for success in life!"

I couldn't agree more and I continually thank the Lord that He brought the Browns into my life. I know He will continue to do great things through them, and through this ministry. If you would like to support Lantaw-Ugma Outreach financially, please send your donation via check to:






"Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world" James 1:27 E.S.V.

Great verse, right? But how many believers actually live it out? More to the point, how many believers would be willing to go around the world to live it out? It is my great pleasure to share with you today the story of two such servants of Christ – Michael and Heaven Brock, and a little girl named Alina, who has changed their lives forever.

The Brocks adopted Alina from Ukraine in late 2014, but the seeds of this adoption were actually planted years before. As Heaven recalls, "...in high school, I did Russian Missions, [with Grace Christian School of Anchorage] and we went to the orphanages and worked with the kids there." Not surprisingly, such an experience only deepened an already present desire to one day adopt. As Heaven and soon-to-be-husband Michael Brock were growing closer and moving toward marriage, Heaven made it clear adoption was something she wanted to pursue one day. Michael agreed this was a calling on his heart as well, and though it was unclear whether the biological kids or the adopted kids would come first, they were both open to Christ's will.

Then the shocker came; as Heaven explained, "One day, Mike came to me after a really long night shift and said, 'I really feel that God has placed on my heart to adopt from Ukraine." Naturally Heaven was stunned, but also excited, and the couple began exploring their options. One of the

first things they learned was that Ukraine is a Non-Hague Convention country. In a nutshell, this means that an adoption agency is not required to process the adoption, vastly reducing the paperwork and overall costs of the process. Heaven took the initiative to find the needed social worker for their home study and a lawyer for the final adoption in Ukraine. God was definitely bringing the pieces together, but the ultimate and best piece would be the child herself. For that, the Brocks would be introduced to Alina.

Heaven and Mike had a few basic details they preferred in a child – especially that they were looking for a

girl, but they were open to God's will. Surprisingly, they were told by their facilitator in Ukraine that there was a child ready and waiting for them. However, upon arriving in Ukraine, the Brocks were met with a tough question, "We found you a little girl. However, she's deaf. Are you okay with that?" Heaven and Mike didn't even hesitate – they were more than okay with that. In fact, on the nearly 5,000 mile journey from Alaska, they had ironically been discussing that very possibility, and both had come to the conclusion that they were more than willing to adopt such a child, even before they knew Alina's

With seven-year-old Alina home in Alaska now, she and the Brocks are experiencing a tremendous learning curve as all three work to learn sign language and grow together as a family. As Heaven related with a laugh, "The laundry has doubled, and the electric and heating bills have skyrocketed, but the real challenge is learning sign, learning a new child, and learning to grow together as a family of three."

Naturally the question had to be asked, "How have you seen Christ's faithfulness through the entire process?" One of the things the Brocks had actually worried about was being torn between multiple children, so they prayed that God would show them the specific

child they were to adopt; and they were shown only Alina! Additionally, locking down a court date proved problematic, resulting in a 9 week stay in Ukraine, compounded by a cantankerous judge known for rejecting adoptions simply because she was having a bad day. However, that very judge approved their adoption and approved it quickly! And miracle of miracles, God kept the very hyper Alina calm and sleeping for 13 hours of the 17 hour train ride back to Kyiv.

I concluded by asking, "For anyone considering adoption, what advice would you give them?" Heaven's advice was simple, "Just do it!" God provided in every way for the Brocks, from amazing donors to court details to the right child – even the simple luxury of a working toilet on the train was something Heaven and Mike were praising Him for. Ultimately, the point is, Christ is faithful, so have faith and watch Him do amazing things.

As Heaven's former teacher, I couldn't be more proud of the Brock family, and I can't wait to see where God will take them over the next few years. They truly are examples of Christ's boundless love, and I know Alina will have an amazing life with them. May they all be richly blessed!



Capturing the soul of a new culture.

Alaskan couple takes love of teaching and photography to Cambodia to serve Christ.

They say a picture is worth a thousand words. If that is true, then Kirsten Belloni has millions of words to her credit. As a teacher and professional photographer, Mrs. Belloni has captured countless breathtaking images over the years. As a yearbook teacher at Grace Christian School for a decade, it was my privilege to publish her photos year after year as she captured the memories of our outgoing seniors with the skills of a master. However, during the 2013-2014 school year, God had a much different plan for the Belloni family that would give Kirsten an entirely new realm of memories to capture. That realm in one word was: Cambodia.

Grace Christian School now conducts an annual mission trip to Cambodia each summer, and Kirsten remembers the seeds of her own participation being planted when Grace's former superintendent, Nate Davis, shared his own experience in Cambodia with his faculty. A call was sent out for possible participants in a school trip the next summer, and Kirsten gave a tentative yes. The next Christmas, as Kirsten related with a laugh, "Mr. Davis asked, 'So are you still interested in going?' and I said, 'Yeah, yeah, we're still interested,' and he said, 'Great! You're going!" Ultimately, it felt like Cambodia chose them and not the other way around.

The first trip lasted for two weeks, and then the next year for their second go around, Kirsten and her husband Mike received a challenge from long time missionary to Cambodia, Mark Bouman. He said simply, "You know, you could do more here." So answering that challenge, the Bellonis decided to stay an additional two weeks after the school team left to do some professional development with the Cambodian teachers. Kirsten recalls, "I remember standing at the airport watching the team leave and thinking, 'I don't want to stay here by myself!"" Staying behind in an unfamiliar culture for any length of time would have been daunting for anyone, but the Lord wasn't done stretching the Bellonis yet.

The wedding plans of the Bellonis' son Wayland and soon to be daughterin-law Brandi, prevented them from returning for the regular school trip the following summer, so they decided to plan their own two week trip. However, soon that trip stretched to a few more weeks - the summer - and finally the conclusion came, "Why don't we just stay for the whole year!" This decision came with some sacrifices; their house had to be sold, along with many possessions. They also conducted a support letter writing campaign. It wasn't hard to begin to see Christ's faithfulness as everything came together, and as Kirsten explained, perhaps the biggest blessing came in

seeing her husband's heart grow toward Cambodia. Though Mike had always

considered Alaska to be his mission field, God opened his heart to the people of Cambodia. That, in and of itself, was a tremendous affirmation that they were standing solidly in His will.

After a summer in the American South with friends, Mr. and Mrs. Belloni finally made it to Cambodia in October 2013. They would be working with two specific organizations - Asian Hope and the local Assembly of God Church in Phnom Penh, the Cambodian capital. Both organizations have school projects, and the Assembly of God has an orphanage. The Bellonis spent the majority of their time traveling and serving with these various projects. While in the capital, they worked primarily with the Logos School, and most of their work focused on professional development - especially biblical integration, an essential component in any Christian school.

Now, you simply cannot call something a Belloni experience if there is not a camera involved somewhere, so I had to ask, "How did you come to know and appreciate the Cambodian culture through the lens of your camera?" One of the key things that God knows about Kirsten is how much

her camera helps her open up to people. As she explained, "I tend to be shy toward people...but when I have a camera in my hand, and I want a picture of something, I'm much more forward." The Bellonis began simply by taking pictures of the people in their neighborhood, and then God gave them the idea to print the pictures and take them back to the people they had photographed. The message was clear -"I saw you. I noticed you. I care about you. I think you're valuable and beautiful." This turned into the perfect opportunity to build relationships and to share the love of Christ.

Christ is so amazingly faithful, but naturally the Bellonis encountered challenges along the way. As Kirsten recalled, possibly the greatest challenge was not being able to immediately have whatever they wanted or needed. The American mindset of if I don't have it, I'll run to the store and get it, simply didn't translate into Cambodian life. No mail, limited grocery options, and other Third World limitations took some definite getting used to. And, of course, of equal difficulty was being on the literal other side of the world from family. Kirsten lost her mother unexpectedly shortly before they returned to the States, and that combined with the prolonged separation from other family made for some very tough times while in the field.

Even so, the best and greatest family anyone could ask for, Christ, was right by their sides the entire time, and the Bellonis had the chance to see him glorified in amazing ways! Many of the relationships they formed seemed predestined by Christ - including one with Ryan, a music teacher, with a direct connection to Nate Davis back in Alaska. It was also encouraging to see the Cambodians' hearts for teaching, and how much they wanted to do it for Him. It is the Bellonis' hope that Christ will continue to be glorified in the relationships they formed while in Cambodia and continue to develop even now with the help of technology.

My final question for the Bellonis was, "What advice would you give to someone considering service in the foreign mission field?" Kirsten, of course, said, "Just do it." But then her daughter, Heaven, broke in with perhaps the most profound advice I have ever heard, "People say they don't have time or can't afford it, but you can't put a price on eternal life! Even if one person finds the Lord, that's worth every penny you spend." Who could possibly argue with that?

It's been a very snow-less winter for the rest of the state of Alaska, but we've maintained at least a dusting here at Victory. Right now we have a solid foot which is meager by normal comparisons, but for this winter it's a lot! Winters around here get very long, especially at this time of year, and I really struggle with missing the light. Fortunately, there are still beautiful skies to see even if

~Pray for our continued process in raising support to reach our monthly goal of \$3,800 to help provide for all the needs of a family in ministry.


My prayers are certainly with the Hostetters and the entire Victory family, and I know with Christ 2015 will be an incredible year at Victory Bible Camp.



Bringing Hope in the Village of Redemption.

Rachel Dunaway continues impact to hearts for Christ in Uganda.

"God, please don't send me to Africa...I don't think I have what it takes!" This line comes straight from a colorful puppetry sketch I remember performing as a puppeteer at Calvary Baptist Church in Prineville, Oregon back in the 90s. The sketch is meant to be the comical story of a reluctant missionary pleading with God not to send him to the wilds of Africa where he is certain doom awaits him. It might seem easy to laugh at something as silly as that, but I think every Christian can identify with the fear that God is going to send us to some far flung land to serve Him. The bold few who will take Him up on the challenge are rare, especially when it comes to Africa, but I happen to know one of them: Ms. Rachel Dunaway.

I have known Rachel since I was very young. We both grew up in Prineville, Oregon, and her father, Joel Dunaway, has been the longtime senior pastor of my home church of Calvary Baptist. It was very easy to see Rachel's heart for Christ as we were growing up, and so I was not surprised to hear she had chosen a career that would take her to the mission field in Africa.

Specifically, Rachel is serving in Lira, Uganda at Calo Me Lare, a ministry within Project Hope Worldwide. The ministry of Calo Me Lare, according to the PHW website is to "...care for and provide hope for orphans in Lira who have been most impacted by the AIDS epidemic and 23 years of war with the rebel forces of Northern Uganda. Our goal is to provide a nurturing home, a quality education, sufficient medical care, an effective character based mentoring program and an ongoing community that will empower them to establish themselves in a career and serve as leaders in their communities and country."

Rachel's serves as a Child Development Specialist and Child Correspondence Coordinator. As she describes it, her job is to "...make sure each child feels safe, valued, and loved." Part of this includes helping children deal with their past abuses and traumas, and helping to maintain communication between children and sponsors. As anyone might imagine, this would be a very difficult job with both cultural and language barriers standing in the way, so Rachel decided to start things slowly by building one relationship at a time. This soon grew into group work, and in time Rachel's dedication and love were well known to the orphans of Calo Me

The format of Calo Me Lare is a unique one. The village is comprised of two circles of eight homes each. Each home consists of a house mother who is a widow from the community and up to eight children. Each child attends school and receives training in money management, agriculture, positive character development, vocational training. Those showing ability are also provided the opportunity to attend a university and ultimately enter a career field of their own choosing. Significant effort is also made to help children maintain contact with their home tribes and cultures so that one day they can return and make a positive impact.

Having been deeply impacted by government corruption extremist groups like The Lord's Resistance Army [a big reason why many of the children at Calo Me Lare are orphans in the first place], opportunities for success in Uganda can be very rare. And finding Christlike love from strangers can seem an impossibility. Yet, faithful servants of Christ like Rachel are shining His light and love most profoundly amongst these children and changing their lives forever.

Now, a few years into her ministry at Calo Me Lare, Rachel continues to serve with diligence, and she has had the opportunity to see both the program and the children grow. As she says, "I feel very valued and loved here." She has even been unofficially adopted into a local family, and she strives every day to learn the language and the culture of the people of Uganda better. I can't wait to see what God will continue to do through the ministries of Project Hope Worldwide. It is sure to be amazing, but as with every ministry, outside help is needed. The greatest need is for child sponsors. Sponsorships start at around \$38 dollars a month and help provide much needed resources for children in desperate situations.
