Who is the Dissident?

It is the end of summer camp time, but are you familiar with camps for adults? For years, particularly since the Obama administration, there have been rumors labeled conspiracies, about large encampments being built across the US, with a concern over what their purpose would be. One such use, would be to contain and control 'dissidents'; anyone opposed to the views and narratives of the ruling party. That's not possible, some would say. But look at our history:

Reporter Greg Reese wrote "The United States operated Native American concentration camps in the 1830s that went on for decades and later evolved into Reservations. During both world wars the United States deployed concentration camps. During world war two, about a thousand indigenous Aleuts of Alaska were forced into camps as their homes were burned to the ground so that invading Japanese forces could not use them. After the war, the United States seized Okinawan homes and burned them to the ground to make way for military bases, forcing threehundred-thousand civilians into concentration camps. And deliberately starved about a million Germans to death in prison camps. The Subversive Activities Control Act of 1950 led to the construction of concentration camps meant to hold American dissidents. In 1961 the US forced eight million South Vietnamese civilians into prison camps to deprive the Viet Cong of any potential support." Have you forgotten post Hurricane Katrina, when police and National Guard went home by home sometimes entering homes and taking guns away from innocent citizens. All of this type of control is in the

name of public safety, but is it? FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, has been a king pin in the process of controlling a population after any declared "Emergency". There are obviously emergencies where assistance is needed, but there are also created or declared emergencies where powers are able to take more control, without consent, claiming authority for your own sake.

The Patriot Act after 9/11 was the turning point when American citizens officially became potential enemies of the state. By 2006, then Pres. Bush amended the National Defense Authorization Act to grant the Pres. power to declare martial law, which in 2007 adding Directive 51, means "For the smallest of reasons, included in the documents own text, any incident in the world, regardless of location, that affects population, infrastructure, environment,

economy or government functions can trigger at the President's will, total martial law".

In most recent times, during project COVID, healthy people with no symptoms were arrested and locked in prison camps after failing a fraudulent PCR test in Australia. Camps are being built all over the world, and there is a plan for whom they are built. There is an interview by Clayton Morris of Redacted, with a US Border Patrol agent turned filmmaker, named J.J. Carrell, who discusses his research on prison facilities being built in all 50 continental US states to hold millions of political dissidents. His facts come straight from US bid descriptions for detention facilities, and their requirements of what jobs are being solicited for such locations. During Carrell's research, an interviewee told him straight out, the facilities are for dissident Americans.

THE MAIL & BALLOTS Colorado has been utilizing a mail in ballot

Colorado has been utilizing a mail in ballot system since 2013, way before the project COVID 19 scare, so one would think that residents would be used to how the process works. The Secretary of State's Office confirmed there were 376 voters who did not receive their original mail ballots in Dolores County at the designated time. The new print vendor contracted in 2024 is K&H, selected because they would accommodate such a small county print job. K & H Printing's specialty is vote-by-mail ballots. Located in Seattle Washington, "There's no "tomorrow" in the election business. We're the most customer-focused and production-ready ballot printing and mailing vendor in the western United States." their website states. Ballots are now printed in Washington state, then shipped to Albuquerque NM, where they are mailed out via USPS to registered voters in Colorado. This is not new.

The County Clerks Office was aware of people complaining of missing ballots a couple of weeks prior to primary election day. The clerk's office then contacted the ballot printing company immediately to confirm that the ballots had been mailed to all active County voters. The printing company was able to confirm that all ballots were mailed out. After several weeks, more details were revealed that the ballots arrived in Albuquerque but some were then



transported to Tennessee where they sat for a while via the USPS, before eventually being mailed back to NM and on to voters in CO long after the election. Northern CO newspapers pointing fingers at the Clerk are misinformed, as it was clearly the USPS at fault. When local voters knew they did not receive a ballot, over 100 of those residents went physically in to the Clerk office and requested replacement ballots.

The primary ballot had a very close race for the Republican contest in District 58. All 8 counties were required to do a recount as the margin fell within 0.5% - in this case just 3 votes, and the recount was completed and officially released with the same margin of 3 votes putting Larry Don Suckla as the Republican primary winner. He will face Democratic candidate Kathleen Curry in the general election for CO Dist. 58 on Nov. 5 2024.

BIG VOTING YEAR

For primary and any other elections held, notices are put out in the newspapers and in the County courthouse, as well as across TV news stations where possible. It is the responsibility of every registered voter to make sure they are correctly signed up to receive the ballots, which you can do in Colorado by going to govotecolorado.gov, checking the address where you are registered to receive your ballot, and there you can easily provide an email address, so that they will notify you when your ballot is mailed, when your ballot has been received, and when your ballot is counted - all through the free BallotTrax program. In Utah, all of the voting registration and tracking the mail or ballots can be managed through Vote.Utah.gov If you do not have your ballot in a timely manner, the next step is to go to your local Clerk's office and request a replacement. If transportation is a challenge, Dolores County Senior and Public Transportation provides a Demand Response Transit service for area residents. Service hours are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday - Friday and for prescheduled special events. A 24-hour notice is requested to schedule rides.



Scheduling of rides is determined on a first call basis.

Mark your calendar for this fall: October 11th will be the first day the Nov. 5th Election Ballots will be mailed out in Colorado and likely in most states. Mail them back a good week before to make sure they arrive by the deadline of 7pm Nov. 5th, or better yet, walk your ballot in to the courthouse or an authorized drop box. To be registered to vote, you must supply a valid form of identification. but you are not required to show proof of your citizenship when voting, as during the registration process you affirmed your citizenship. In CO SB24-182 was signed into law, concerning the requirements to issue an identification document under the "CO Road and Community Safety Act" to an individual who is not lawfully present in the US, if the individual meets certain requirements. *(CONTINUED ON PAGE 3)*

Immigrant Identification Document Issuance

(CONTINUED FROM PAGE 2) The act changes these requirements by:

• Repealing the requirement that the applicant have filed a Colorado resident income tax return;

• Repealing the requirement that the applicant demonstrate residency in the state for the immediately preceding 2 years;

• Repealing the requirement that the applicant provide a documented social security number or individual taxpayer identification number; and

• Allowing an applicant to present a passport, consular identification card, or military identification document from the applicant's country of origin that is unexpired or expired less than 10 years before the date of the applicant's application for a driver's license or identification document.

The act authorizes the use of exceptions processing, which is a hearing to determine whether an applicant possesses evidence sufficient to prove the applicant qualifies for an identification document, for identification document applicants who are not lawfully present in the United States. The department will promulgate rules concerning exceptions processing and the use of documents issued by an agent or agency of the United States government to prove a person qualifies for a Colorado identification document. The new school year 2024-25 will kick off with a big ceremony in Dove Creek CO, for the grand opening of the Elementary school building this year. There are several school builds going on in the region, and several schools that are looking to expand or improve their facilities. The Dove Creek build is nearly finished, the facility will be ready for school kids, while the exterior landscaping and playground and parking facilities continue to be under construction.

The Grand Opening ribbon cutting ceremony will be on August 7th starting 5pm along with the local non profit R.O.C.K. providing school supplies and hosting a fun event for that evening - the community is welcome to attend! (see more on page 5)

7th Street Elementary was finally torn down completely, part of the grounds will be rebuilt into playground and parking areas.

GOOD GONE BAD

News Break, Supreme Court: "SCOTUS tosses out Chevron Deference Policy!" Huh? What is "Chevron Deference policy" and why should I care? Lets' avoid writing a 500 page government Documentary which could be fitting for a Tom Clancy government intrigue novel. In brief, the "policy" has, for the past 40 years, impacted costs of all goods and services including fuel, energy, food, health, security, ad infinitum! Whoa! Where did this come from? The short story summary began in the 1960's when some were expressing the need to clean up some water and air pollution from the industrial revolution and wars. Sounds like a GOOD thing to do!

In 1970, then President Richard Nixon, by executive order, established the Environmental Protection Agency, EPA, within the Presidential Administrative Agency group, to do research on impacts of pollutants on the total environment, to monitor and establish baselines to measure change on treatment success. This was not a congressional established Agency, but was "treated" as Cabinet, funded and authorized for Rule making authority for implementation of Acts passed on all environmental issues for all Food, Cabinet Agencies, such as Transportation, Air Quality, Water Resources, Endangered Species, Clean Air Act, Land Use, Wild and Scenic Rivers, etc. Several thousands of Rules have been made over the years affecting all aspects of your life and industry. Congress has enabled and empowered an Administrative Agency to control the lives of the people and economic system via the "Rule" making process. How so?

First, be aware, Acts of Congress (and State legislatures) are not written by the legislators, but written by lawyers of special interest groups, who then convince a legislator to introduce and push it. The Bills are a "framework of purpose and intent", which if passed, is then later fleshed out by "Rules and Regulations" to make it operable under the proposed "legislative intent" by you guessed it, the lawyers of the proposers of the Act. In 1984, there was a court challenge between Chevron Oil and Natural Resources Defense Council, where the court decided the judges should "defer" to federal agencies in interpreting ambiguous parts of statutes on environmental science specifics. The idea was, if Congress passes a law where something is unclear-or there is a "gap"-it is up to the agency to fill in the gap, not the Court. This is referred to as "Chevron Deference" policy. This gave the federal government, (ie) EPA the freedom to create and implement rules without fear of legal battles. The Rule maker became its own judge and jury. The EPA has "Ruled" over States and industries on behalf of environmental NGO's since 1984 using this principle. The recent Supreme Court of the United States decision was a challenge to the "Deference" principle on EPA "Rule Making". The new "Rule" in question, demanded the several



Supreme Court of the United States (SCOTUS) overturned the Chevron Defence Policy

States' power generation plants must reduce emissions of air borne pollutants, specifically Ozone, by an arbitrary amount, from crossing into other States, using another EPA Rule of "Good Neighbor" provision for Clean Air. The States claim the "Plan" would damage the Nations electric grid, and is simply a "failed experiment" to try to show Ozone production as affecting climate change. The EPA was depending upon the Courts continuing with the "Chevron Deference" principle, giving EPA the ultimate ruling authority on all matters "environmental". Note, Ozone is naturally occurring being produced and destroyed naturally in the environment.

The SCOTUS decision simply returns the interpretive power of Congressional Acts to the Courts, instead of deferring to the unelected federal bureaucrats. This will benefit the States and people, by reigning in the "out of control" Agency, especially where the federal government is the principle land owner. The faux environment NGO's and EPA are upset, and stated, they will find a way around the ruling. The recent move to get rid of the Constitutional SCOTUS members explains their intent. Now that the "Run Away" EPA has been slowed down, we are ok, right? NOPE! On June 20 th the EPA announced its "EPA 2024-2027 Climate Adaptation Plan" to expand previous

Workforce, Facility Resilience, Developing Resilient Supply Climate Chains, Integrating Climate-Resilience into Funding Opportunities, Applying Climate Data and Tools to Decision Making, Integrating Climate Adaptation into Rulemaking Processes. All this is in concert with the false UN Climate Crises. Did you think the EPA was all about saving the world from dirty water and saving trees? So what will happen to this EPA Plan now that the "Chevron Deference Policy" has been tossed?

NOTHING, unless the States step up and take action to control and govern themselves, including their lands and resources starting at the local County level. A GOOD idea of pollution control has ended in BAD government controls! As an interesting note, the EPA has existed only 54 years and now has over 19,000 employees. The EPA policies have affected everyone in all States with NO accountability for bad outcomes. Today,

eighty percent of Congress delegates were young teenagers or not yet born when the EPA was created just 54 years ago and they have no idea about the purpose or the Chevron Deference policy and how it has affected their lives. Nor have most of us! Dexter Gill, My View!

With grocery store prices soaring to unobtainable levels on many products, what are some other options? Consider foraging, a skill useful with or without a collapse of the food supply system. There are abundant edible herbs and plants in the wild or perhaps in your backyard. The "Universal Edibility Test" is a technique detailed in the US Army Manual to test for those plants that are safe to eat. (Look it up). It's much easier, however, if you familiarize yourself with what you know to be safe before you have to eat in an emergency.

A few obvious tips include not eating plants along roadsides or areas exposed to pesticides or chemicals. Gloves are always good to wear. What is available depends where you are located - high mountains provide different options from low deserts. Read up on the wild edibles for your specific terrain, and you may want to start growing or propagating those that you know you can eat. Look to berries, in the SW CO zone, choke cherries grow well. Cattails - though an invasive feature in some ponds, in the wild, they provide a range of edible options harvested in late June July. Chickory is another wild growing edible, with their roots being used as a caffeine free coffee substitute. You may be lucky to find abundant three leaf clover, as Trifolium is

The proponents of the Dolores River National Monument have not done this. They have gone behind the back of the local communities to garner outside support for their idealistic cause. I believe that the


Great Day in the Woods By Adam Warren

Another great day in the woods. Alpha (my son) and I went out today with the goal of matching up the drop tine buck I found earlier this year. If you follow me, you might recall that I had found a drop tine buck and then found the other side. As luck would have it, the 2nd one was the same buck, same side from the previous year. So we went to the same area pulled off the road and almost ran over a small 2 point antler while parking. It was a premonition of things to come.

Next I found a brown spindly 3 point. I told Alpha to circle in the same area because either the same buck or another herded up with him might drop an antler close. I heard him hollering just 5 minutes later. All I could understand through the excited gibberish was '5 point'. He came running up with a nice heavy brown 5 point smattered with dirt from a recent thunderstorm.

We started circling again and there was a small 4 point laying under some thick pinion trees. Alpha was already running for it before I could even say anything. I walked another 50 yards and said "there's the other side of your buck Alpha!" It wasn't, though. The base was sticking up in the air oddly. I walked up and just looked at it. Alpha came up and said "That's the one we're looking for!" Sure enough, he had a drop tine that was acting as a kickstand. I got excited and started dancing around like an idiot with Alpha laughing the whole time. We circled around some more and witnessed another lifetime memory.

Doing his best to hide 20 yards away, was a calf elk. I calmly told Alpha to circle over to me as quietly as he could. He came over and I showed him the calf laying down hiding. He crept up to about 15 yards taking a video when it suddenly blew out of there in elk fashion



tearing down a dead tree, and scaring the bejeesus out of Alpha on the way. We picked up one more big 4 point deer horn and left for the Dolores River at Slick Rock.



This Flu is for the Birds

"He who controls the weather, control the world" former Pres. Dwight D. Eisenhower - then Henry Kissinger stated, "Who controls the food supply controls the people". 

COLORADO PARKS WILDLIFE

Colorado's Parks and Wildlife is concerned about a high rate of drowning deaths in various water conditions so far this year, emphasizing the importance of wearing life jackets. The deaths have occurred all across the state, from lakes to rivers, from paddle boards to kayaks.

A new law went into effect on June 1, 2024, changing the age requirements to operate a motorboat in Colorado. The new law prohibits the operation of a motorboat, including a personal watercraft (PWC, jet ski, ski-doo), by a person who is less than 18 years of age. A person who is at least 14 years of age but less than 18 years of age may operate a motorboat if the person has completed a boating safety course approved by CPW and possesses a boating safety certificate issued by the boating safety course provider. This boating age law does not apply to non-motorized vessels such as kayaks, canoes, and stand-up paddleboards, but life jacket requirements still apply.

DURANGO CO



Construction is in full swing on the new 70 foot radar tower that will support a C-band radar at the Durango La Plata County Airport when it is completed by the end of summer. This long awaited installment is set to fill in coverage for weather radar that is not included through the Grand Junction system, due to terrain contours. In a press release, Baron Weather Vice Pres. of Integrated Weather System, Jon Tarleton said, "The radar will fill a hole in the National Weather Service's (NWS) coverage of radars across the U.S. - The Baron radar will have the same capabilities that the NWS radars are equipped with, so this new system will fill in that gap while creating accurate forecasts to maximize lifesaving potential by protecting residents from severe weather."



COLORADO - MT. LIONS

CPW is actively looking to find more cases of rustrela virus, a disease affecting mountain lions and a usually fatal neurologic syndrome recognized in domestic cats, they report. The CDC study, lead author is former CPW Wildlife Pathologist Dr. Karen Fox, current research scientist at CSU. Also called "Staggering disease". In May of 2023, CPW euthanized

Pickleball has become a growing popular 'sport' in the US, a smaller than tennis ball court, with lighter balls and rackets larger than ping pong or table tennis ones. There has been interest in towns like Moab, for more courts to handle the demand. In June, the decision was made to create new Pickleball courts at the Old Spanish Trail Arena south of the town. The approval came at a mid June Grand County Commissioner meeting, unanimously voted upon, it will include 6 courts and an ADA compliant playground at the facility.

Funding will come from a collaboration of the Utah Division of Outdoor Recreation and the National Park Service's Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF), with matching funds at a Federal level and local County level. The budget for creating six courts on undeveloped property around the arena, is estimated at \$300,000.

The largest electricity provider in Utah, Rocky Mountain Power, filed an application to increase residential electricity rates in the state by 30.5%. The increase would happen in two stages, one increasing the average price of kilowatt hours to 12.89 cents from 10.96. That is aimed for February of 2025. But the ultimate increase is geared to 14.13 cents on January of 2026. Their press release indicated the increase is due to increased costs of fuel and wholesale power, along with new electric transmission and generation project costs. They also point to the risks of wildfire insurance premiums as additional expenses they need to pass along to the customer. Utah Gov. Spencer Cox is working to prevent this proposal from coming to fruition.

Meanwhile, an activist group, Cats Aren't Trophies, working in Colorado gathered enough signatures to put a Mt Lion and Bobcat hunting ban proposal on the 2024 November ballot. Initiative 91 has til mid August for the signatures to be cured, verified and the initiative submitted officially for the ballot. Opponents see this as a measure to revoke wildlife management decisions from state biologists turning it over to a potentially uninformed public vote. The mass detention scenario of Rex 84 was



Summer Time Salad - Hail Caesar

Caesar Salad - it seems to trigger people who either really love it, or hate it. It's a fresh and crunchy great cool simple salad for hot late summer days. Add some grilled chicken or grilled salmon or any flaked fish, and you have a complete meal. The classic recipe is simply romaine lettuce, croutons, Parmesan cheese preferably shaved, with "Ceasar" dressing. The dressing is olive oil, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce, Dijon mustard and garlic. In other recipes the dressing adds anchovy paste, which is what can turn a lot of people off, but that is not needed. And the use of a raw egg in the original creation, is optionally included these days.

There is some interesting history to this salad too. You may have thought, like I did for many years, that this must be an Italian design - hail Cesar and all... but no. It was 'invented' in the early 1920s by a man named Caesar Cardini, an Italian chef in San Diego who owned a restaurant in Tijuana Mexico! So I guess we are still partly right.

The man moved his family from California to Mexico to avoid Prohibition in the US. It

Recipe

Use only the ultra crisp inner leaves of romaine lettuce rinsed and dried on paper towel, tear, don't cut, the largest leaves.

Croutons: why not make garlic croutons by taking bread cubes tossed in minced garlic infused oil, baked til crisp, add a little Paremsan cheese before turning light brown. Save the pressed garlic from the infusion for the dressing. For an emulsified dressing, which clings to the lettuce better, basically, you'll be making a light flavored mayonnaise.

Basic dressing / Mayonnaise recipe:

One egg, teaspoon dijon mustard, tablespoon fresh lemon juice, minced garlic, one cup neutral oil, salt and pepper, use an immersion blender to gently bring the ingredients together.
