PRIMARY ELECTIONS

Look in the US mail for your primary ballot, Colorado resident Primary ballots are mailed out starting June 3rd. This is mail in, or drop off at the Clerk's office box during operational hours only. There will not be drop boxes (VSPC) for these ballots. In Dolores County, there are two County Commissioner positions that are up for election or re-election. The Republican Candidates are: District 2: Steve Garchar (incumbent), District 3: Margret Daves, and Phyllis Davis. If you are unaffiliated, you will receive both Democrat and Republican ballots if available, and have the choice to submit only one. The Primary election ends June 25th 7pm.

In Dolores County, there are unaffiliated candidates that will also be on the Nov. ballot, District 2: Eric Stiasny, District 3: Paula Stewart. There is still the opportunity for someone to run as a write in for the Nov. ballot as well.

Dove Creek, CO - The open position for the Dolores County Judge was selected to be Ian MacLaren. He was sworn in as Dolores County Court Judge on June 3 at 2pm at the Dove Creek Courthouse. He is replacing the outgoing Judge Matt Margeson.

Judge MacLaren will be continuing as the Municipal Court Judge for the Town of Dove Creek, CO. He will be moving to Dove Creek on June 1. MacLaren told the Pinto Bean, "I feel honored to have been appointed to serve as the Dolores County Court Judge. Working as a journalist covering Dove Creek High School's football team more than a decade ago, I was impressed by the tight-knit, rural, nature of Dolores County. County residents were incredibly accepting and the support that community members showed to one another in a day and age where so much disconnect exists in the world was refreshing. I feel extremely lucky to have the opportunity to serve the Dolores County community in a meaningful way."



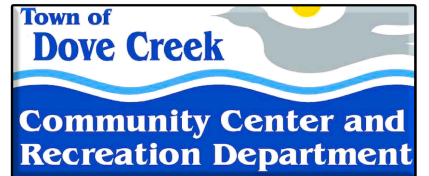

Cost of Stamps Going Up

Writing a letter has practically gone completely out of style. Birthday cards may still find their way to a mail box, but mostly there are bills, promotions and junk mail that are sent by post. Those "forever stamps" have been quite popular, though a philatelist may not agree (stamp collector), and one will still 'pay' for a first class letter to get where it's going. The price, however, is going up once again - July 14th the First Class Mail forever stamp will increase to 73 cents, up a nickel from the previous 68 cent version.

It was 2007 when they first introduced the 'forever' concept. That was 41 cents. Postcards will go to 56 cents within the US, while internationally they will rise to \$1.65. So much for those inexpensive ways to let your family know you are having fun on vacation in a far off land!

This is part of a 10 year plan towards profitability. It's a challenging market with emails and texts and cell phones so abundant. USPS in November reported a \$6.5 billion loss for fiscal 2023, and is projecting a \$6.3 billion deficit in 2024.

to ensure that people and animals can live together and avoid conflict that impacts humans and animals,” said Governor Polis. Local governments, NGOs, HOAs, community groups, businesses, tribes, universities and individuals were all eligible to receive funding for grants between \$50,000 and \$500,000.

In other CO news, Gov. Polis signed into law in May, a path for Colorado wildlife authorities to reintroduce the North American wolverine. This is contingent on a federal waiver related to the Endangered Species Act. The Fish and Wildlife is not revealing where the animals would be released, but biologist experts say they are best in snow / high alpine environments.

Human Animal Interaction - Bears to Wolverines

To help with wildlife conflicts in local communities across Colorado, CPW and Gov. Polis offered \$1 million dollars in a grants program this past May. The primary concern with this program is for human-bear conflict reduction. Wildlife managers estimate that Colorado has between 17,000 - 20,000 bears, and the population is stable and growing.

“Colorado is known for our incredible wild spaces and the animals that call our state home. These grants will help support more bear-proof homes and neighborhoods

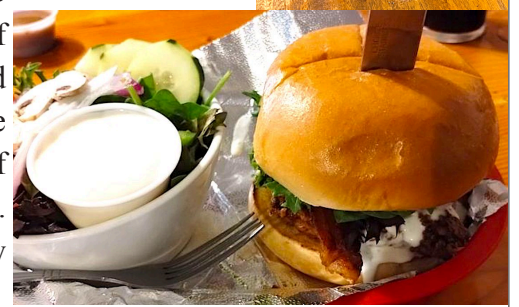

A Different Perspective of the proposed Dolores River National Monument

The Global Biodiversity Assessment was designed as a guide for creating national policies to implement the United Nations's Convention on Biodiversity, which was the centerpiece of the 1992 Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro. Although then-President George Bush declined to sign the treaty, Bill Clinton eagerly signed the pact in June 1993 and made preparations for its implementation as domestic policy.

Had the Senate ratified the Biodiversity treaty, it would have formally committed the United States to carry out the "Wildlands Project," a scheme to convert land of the continental United States into one huge "biodiversity preserve." Under the Wildlands Project at least 50% of land of America would be returned to "core wilderness" area with no human activity. Those areas would be connected by "corridors" a few miles wide where human activity would be limited and the core areas and corridors would be surrounded by "cooperation zones" where humans would be allowed to live. The "Wildlands Project" is now being implemented through among many other federal regulations; President Biden's "America the Beautiful" initiative. Conservation easements are a tool for the "Wildlands Project" to use the Endangered Species Act as a weapon to take control of private lands to end grazing and agricultural practices.

While in the beginning I felt the proposed Dolores River National Monument was to overrun our communities with visitors, I now see that it is a way to eventually take our communities off the map and put us into "cooperation zones". The numerous proposed national monuments all over the western United States are not about conservation, it's about control of the people. It is time for the people of the United States to stand up for freedom once again! We will not cooperate!

Civilized People

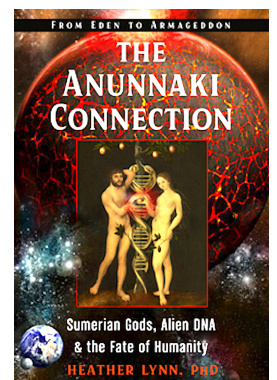

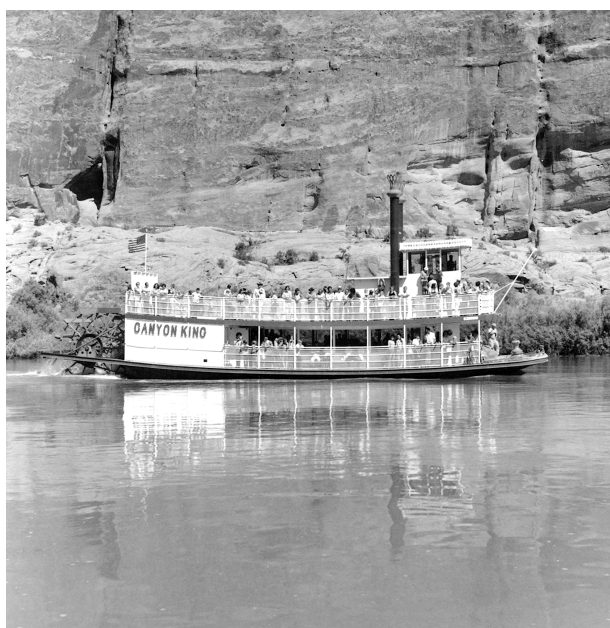

SPOTLIGHT: FRAN BARNES

Francis A. "Fran" Barnes (1922-2003) accompanied by Terry Barnes his wife, was an adventuring traveler, photographer and writer, taking as many roads less traveled and documenting them for generations to follow to learn from and enjoy. Spending most of his life in and around Moab Utah, his guidebooks and articles for magazines and newspapers tell a bigger story than just what trail went where. Self publishing 46 books in a series called Canyon Country, his wife Terby managed the publications (she passed in 2008). She donated the photograph collection and slides to the Moab Museum, which can be found online at moabmuseum.org.

HISTORICAL BUILDINGS

Understanding our past helps us to appreciate our present, and looking to our future. Architectural buildings play a much bigger part in our human character development, than just being structures to keep us out of the elements. More people are beginning to look closely at the amazing details of everything from cathedrals to mental asylums, investigating if there was more advanced 'technology' that was incorporated into many of the designs. To look into that yourself, the 'world's fairs' structures are a great place to start. This topic will bring you down a rabbit hole, as you will discover many buildings that may be much older than first thought as well. (a few key words 'mud floods', 'tartaria', 'spires and copper').

Historical Societies and designations for "historical designation" differs from state to state in the US, in Colorado, the official historical society was established in 1879.



Visit HistoryColorado.org to learn about what types of designations are made across the state. There are also National registers and of course we've already spoken to the World Heritage sites in previous issues. There can be benefits to getting your historic building designated - such as grants and access to other funding to refurbish or maintain the structure according to guidelines.

Recently in Dove Creek, Krystle Holley with the Main Supply Building was visited by invitation, from the State Historic Preservation Office representatives, to review the building and discuss the opportunities with their offices in Denver. 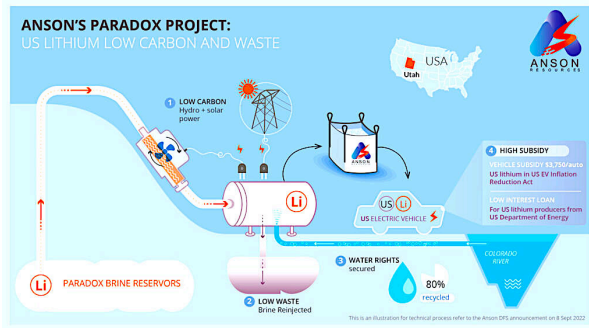

A1 Lithium Green River UT



The Green River Reporter wrote, "On May 1, 2024 Anson Resources was granted the equivalent of about 13,750 acre feet in water rights for their planned lithium wells adjacent to the uranium tailings pile in Elgin. Theresa Wilhelmsen, the state engineer, ruled that the water source located over 10,000 feet underground is not already appropriated, is unconnected to other aquifers in use, and will be used in a non-consumptive manner because Anson plans to reinject spent lithium brine back into the ground."

"A National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review comes next in the lithium well development process, which will cover environmental impacts more comprehensively than the Utah water rights review. A1 Lithium CEO Bruce Richardson said "Our aim is to be a responsible business operator and good community partner". DARK SKY SITES

The Four Corners is overall, a generally 'dark sky' location, as you can see from satellite images; the population centers make for more lighting at night, and thereby blocking out the ability to see as many stars at night. In Colorado Dark Sky Communities include Crestone, Norwood, Nucla/Naturita, Ridgway, and Westcliffe/Silver Cliff, In Utah, designated communities include Castle Valley, Springdale, Helper, Torrey, Thunder Mountain and most recently Moab. They consider these "International Designations" and many of our National Parks and specialty lodging areas are already included.

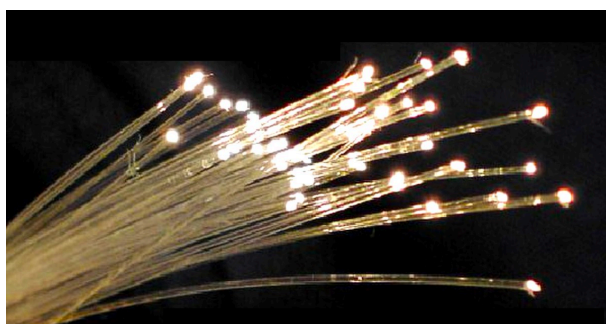
2024 Labor Day Safari RR4W Moab UT

Polis, HB 24-1340 has now created a refundable state income tax credit for lower-income students and their families to fill in costs between scholarships and the full tuition amounts along with additional fees associated with a four year public college, community college, and or trade school. This was one of several new laws to facilitate access and enhancements to higher education in the state.

Colorado Voter Survey Reveals Major Disapproval to Proposed Alcohol Tax

According to Brewers Association, a "newly proposed 200 percent hike in alcohol taxes from Sens. Kevin Priola (D-13th District) and Chris Hansen (D-31st District) has been met with strong opposition from Colorado Voters. In a newly published survey by Nelson Research, the proposal, SB 24-181, "loses support among all major demographic subgroups as more information is known about the funding mechanism and impacts on economy, democratic process, small business/consumers, and overall lack of prioritization of current alcohol tax dollars." Starting with a 2-to-1 general disapproval of alcohol taxes (48.9% opposed vs. 23.3% approve), the measure only fares worse once voters learn how the bill was structured to get around Taxpayer's Bill of Rights (TABOR) provisions as well as its effect on Colorado's economy. Its final disapproval rating is 58% with just 26% in favor." As of early May, the House Committee on Finance Postponed the bill indefinitely.

West African BBQ

Do you like to Barbecue? Are you familiar with Steven Riechlen... if not, he has a ton of cookbooks and videos that will help you with everything from technique to sauces to make your experience perfect! After all, his main book is called "The Barbecue! Bible" first released 25 years ago.

I checked in with his 'trends' for 2024: use of a griddle on your grill, or celebrating the 50 year old ceramic big green egg - not that interesting (must be his sponsor), but I did like that he spoke about a return to real meat - not that anyone here really changed to Impossible Burgers and Beyond Meats for their summer gatherings. But it is interesting that he points to a national cooperative bank, CoBank, saying 'plant based' meats are on the decline, Beyond Meat's stock dropped from over \$200 per share in 2019 to about \$8 at the time of writing in May (Nasdaq BYND). Good news, and common sense, for our ranchers. The best way for plants to be in meat, is to use a cow for processing.

Back to what might be a new taste this summer? Steven brings up Afri-que - so I did some research.



Of course Africa is a huge continent with 52 countries and diverse terrains, thus a plethora of foods and spices change depending on if you eat near the mediterranean, on a coast, or inland. One popular fare in the US is from Western Africa, the Suya: a skewered meat dish. You can find some sort of meat on a stick almost everywhere across the world. This West African street food, is usually beef on a skewer, served with sliced onions, tomatoes, cilantro in some instances. The big flavor in this marinade sauce, is peanut butter. You can go big, more authentic, and roast then grind your own nuts and squeeze the oil out to use just the paste, or find a good creamy natural peanut butter leaving off the separated oil on top. Serve over a jollof rice, or add some grilled small colorful sweet peppers.

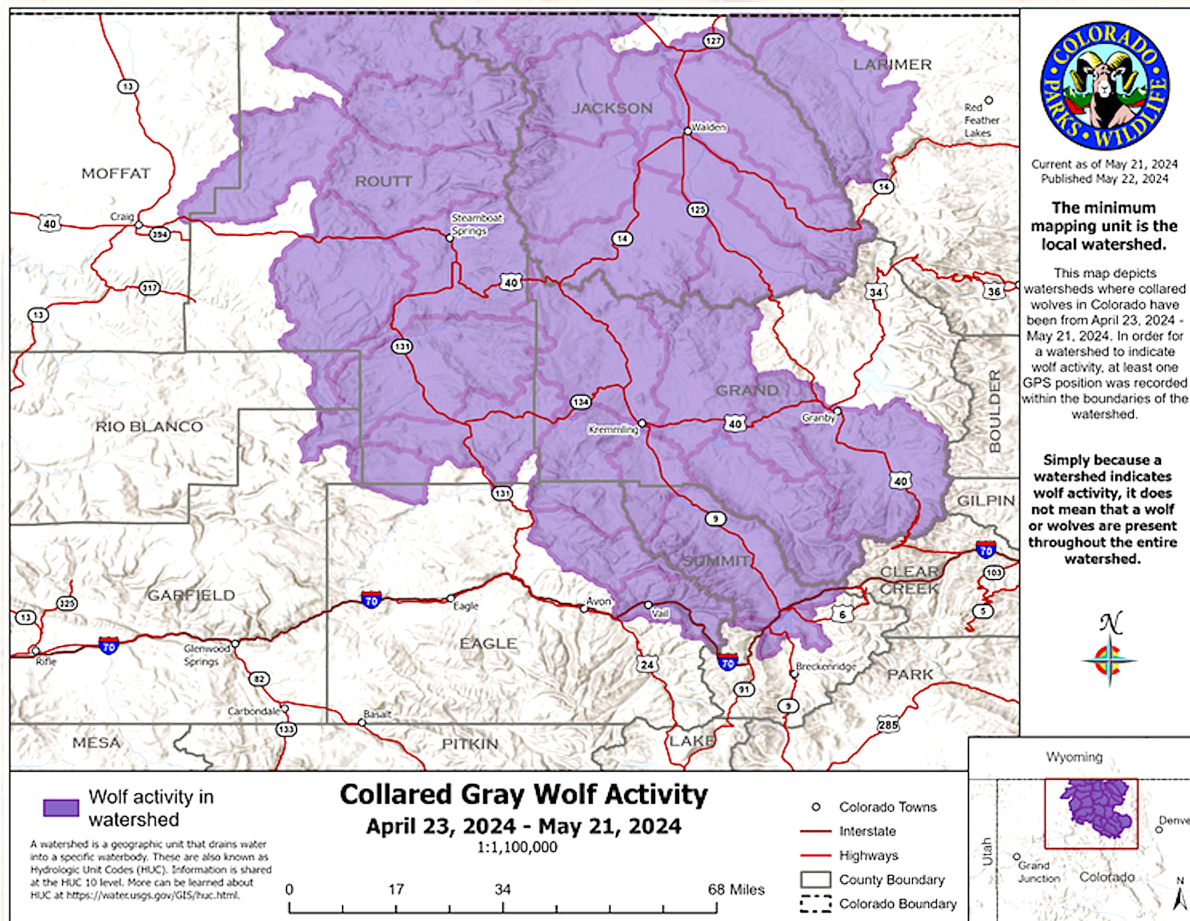
Recipe

Combine the peanut butter, grated onion, tomato paste, with olive oil and the spices. Toss the steak pieces to coat well, cover and keep it in the fridge for at least 2 hours. Your grill should be ready with high heat while you load up the skewers with meat pieces (metal skewers preferred). This is a quick grill, taking just five or six minutes per side, so I like these to be part of the early cocktail hour part of a bbq, so guests can snack on the meat, but it can easily be a main course as well. You might want to make additional sauce to set aside for dipping! (Note: Jollof rice is made by cooking rice in a sauce; blended tomatoes, garlic, sweet red peppers, and onions, with spices and hot pepper too.)

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup creamy natural peanut butter
- 1/2 small yellow onion, grated
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 tablespoon kosher salt
- 2 teaspoons smoked paprika
- 1 teaspoon allspice
- 3/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon powdered ginger
- 2 pounds top sirloin steak cut into 1.5-inch cubes

Delisting Process for Grey Wolf

U.S. House of Representatives in a bipartisan effort, passed Congressman Tom Tiffany's (WI-07) and Congresswoman Lauren Boebert's (CO-03) legislation to delist the gray wolf from the Endangered Species Act. The "Trust the Science Act (H.R. 764)," removes the gray wolf from the list of endangered species and prevents judicial review of the delisting. This bill gives each state and the state wildlife agencies the ability to manage the gray wolf population as they currently manage all wildlife within its state's border.

The bill has been received by the Senate as of May 1, 2024.
