Gold. A standard - literally the "gold standard" that sets the 'bar' for value for as long as we know of 'history'. One of the main reasons people invest in gold holdings, is due to an agreed upon scarcity and intrinsic collaborative value. What the US and world at this point, trade as currency, is called "Fiat", meaning it is government issued without being tied to any substance of value. Since 1971 when the US dollar was decoupled from being backed by a supply of actual gold, it was up to the issuing agencies around the world, to 'print' paper money. Those "federal reserve" banks aren't even a part of the world governments, but independent privately held institutions. The manipulation of providing confidence that a paper bill actually stands for something, has been a huge con (confidence) game. Once a majority of businesses and individuals loose faith in the system creating the currency such as the dollar, for various economic and social reasons, it becomes devalued and sets in motion an economic collapse.

What does it look like when the dollar is no longer the reserve currency and standard? The digits in your account at the bank's computers, can be erased; or simply run away hyperinflation results in sky rocketing prices for goods (research what happened in Zimbabwe by 2009) and the paper money isn't worth anything. Tie that in with unpaid debt, as the US is said to be increasing by \$1 trillion dollars every 3 months or so (over \$34 trillion at the time of print), and

something has to give way.

Smart individuals are looking at how they can convert the existing value of their dollars, to invest into things that are more tangible and will hold value in a collapsing society, such as non mortgaged land, properties, tradable goods, food, supplies and precious metals, and mechanisms to protect those elements from being stolen.

This is no longer just the talk of 'preppers', but of average citizens who can now see the chaos in front of their faces, as well as the richest individuals and governments across the world. China has been increasing their gold reserves for decades now, their purchases in 2023 rose 30% according to the World Gold Council's Demand Trends report. In this case, it is the geopolitical risks at play, affecting every corner of the world.

March will be a telling month. Anticipate a systemic credit event, once commercial property values that have dropped due to vacancies and over extended valuations, combine with their looming debt delinquency which needs to be refinanced against a lowered property value and high interest rates. This said \$900 billion commercial real estate debt will threaten small to mid size banks with 8-10% defaults in their assets, that may put many banks out of business. Bank assets having negative equity, being upside down on their loans, could result in over 300 smaller banks becoming insolvent. But it will affect the big banks as well, with delinquent loan repayments on major holdings, additional consolidation is possible. This goes beyond the USA, with signs of bank contagion running world wide.

Will the soothe sayer's famous phrase from Shakespeare's Julius Caesar play be a warning for the banking system and world currencies? The Ides of March is related to lunar phases, around mid month, and the week of the 11th may just reveal another step in the slow motion collapse. Are you ready?

Where is Dolores County's Economic Development Headed?

At a mid February Dolores County BOCC regular meeting, Region 9 gave the final update for the CDAP plan = Community Development Action Plan 2024-2026. By resolution, the commissioners agreed to the economic development strategy which is published on the Region 9 website.

The CDAP tool is used for projects and initiatives to establish benchmarks and follow up on successes for economic resiliency aligning with existing community plans. The list is updated every three years, and is established with input from community organizations.

"The CDAP document is aimed at county and town economic development practitioners, business leaders, elected officials, and community stakeholders. It provides strategic direction for decisions and projects that will evolve over the next two years. It provides data that can be used to obtain grants for local projects. It also helps to solicit funds collaboratively to meet changing economic and business conditions in the region. Projects being listed in an approved CDAP is required for many state and federal funding sources."

For Dolores County, one example is to address "Agriculture - Food Security Future Ready Economy and Workforce". The list of identified partners includes DCDC, Town Dove Creek, Dolores County, CSU





Extension, and Landowners. Identified potential funding resources include: DOLA, CSU Extension, USDA, DCDC, EDA, OEDIT, Rural Jumpstart and Enterprise Zones. There are no cost or job creation estimates, however the outcomes and impacts are stated as "1) Recruit at least one agricultural product processing facility. 2) Support local farmers' markets. 3) Increase agriculture job numbers. 4) Complete feasibility study for solar project to support agriculture"



Winter at Mesa Verde UNESCO UN Property

In typical years, Mesa Verde gets over a half million visitors. According to the park, fewer than 50 people visit on the quietest off-season days. After the ranger-guided tours end in the fall, enjoy the solitude of photographing Cliff Palace or Spruce Tree House bathed in golden light shown here in a February frozen sunny afternoon.

It's important to note that winter conditions can affect accessibility, and some services and facilities may be limited. During the winter, certain areas of the park may be closed or have restricted access due to snow and weather conditions. If planning a winter visit to Mesa Verde, it's recommended to check the official National Park Service website or contact the park directly for the latest information on road conditions, open closures. trails, and any potential Additionally, be prepared for colder temperatures, snow, and winter weather during your visit.

Mesa Verde is a World Heritage Site, a landmark or area with legal protection by an international convention administered by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). World Heritage Sites are designated by UNESCO for having cultural, historical, scientific or



other forms of significance. These sites are graded and (Administered) by the UN Not the country they are located or within their national territory. (Direct authority over individual properties remains with the national, state, tribal, or local government or private organization that owns and manages the site.) As of September 2023, there are a total of 1,199 World Heritage Sites. Sites are demarcated by UNESCO as protected zones. The World Heritage Sites list is maintained by the international World Heritage Program administered by the UNESCO World Heritage Committee, composed of 21 "states parties" that are elected by the UN General Assembly, and advised by reviews of international panels of experts in natural or cultural history, and education.





Backroading in America

CPW releases 2025-2029 Big Game Season Structure


CPW released its preliminary alternatives and staff recommendations for the 2025-2029 Big Game Season Structure (BGSS). Over the past year, CPW carefully considered various biological, social, and economic factors, as well as internal and external input received during its extensive public outreach process, when developing these BGSS recommendations.

The BGSS planning process is a critical component of big game management and big game hunting regulation development in Colorado and provides a framework for CPW staff to make annual license recommendations. The central purpose of the BGSS planning process is to determine what, when, and where various types of big game hunting opportunities are available, and to determine how the timing of opportunities are divided among hunters. Through this planning process, CPW is better able to maintain healthy wildlife populations in keeping with management objectives.

Some of the changes they address include:

- Change to the previous season structure (2015-2019) for regular deer and elk rifle seasons.
- Maintain the status quo for season structure for early seasons (archery and muzzleloader) for deer and elk west of I-25 and GMU 140; in addition, there shall be an additional stand-alone limited archery antlered deer season that opens August 15th and closes September 1st, annually. This season would be optional and determined on a herd-by-herd basis (DAU/GMU), allowing for regional flexibility. This optional antlered deer season would not replace existing antlered, either-sex, and antlerless deer archery seasons.
- Over-the-counter (OTC) archery: Limit all resident and nonresident archery licenses - limited licenses to be available through the draw by management area (Data Analysis Unit (DAU) or Game Management Unit (GMU)).
- OTC rifle: Maintain the status quo; keep unlimited licenses available for antlered elk during the second and third general rifle seasons in OTC units. Keep limited either-sex or limited antlered elk licenses available in remaining limited units. All antlerless elk licenses remain limited. Limited licenses issued by GMU/DAU.
- Addition of an optional* rifle deer hunt during the first regular rifle season (currently elk only).
- Addition of an optional* second regular rifle buck and doe pronghorn season.
- A change to the BGSS cycle length was considered. CPW recommends maintaining the status quo of conducting a review of the BGSS every five years.
- Administrative topics (cow moose): Optional late cow moose season that would



be additional to the regular moose rifle season, and would be valid for all regular rifle deer and elk seasons (with no hunting during the breaks between seasons) when necessary to meet management objectives for moose.

• Administrative topics (private-landonly (PLO) black bear): Modify the existing language to clarify that PLO rifle bear licenses are not required to be unlimited OTC for every population/DAU (managers could still choose an unlimited PLO OTC strategy).

*Optional: CPW staff would have the option to utilize this season as a tool to meet biological objectives (established in Herd



Management Plans) and/or social management objectives; would be determined on a herd-by-herd basis (DAUs).

CPW will present these preliminary alternatives and staff recommendations to the Parks and Wildlife Commission at the March Commission meeting in Denver; staff are planning a three-step approval process, with the Commission making final decisions on season structure in June.



Recently listening to a Dr. Michael Nehls, a German doctor who has been researching Alzheimers, and now, the workings of our brains in terms of the current apparent lunacy we see all around us; his theory answered a question I hear often - why is it so crazy these days - smart people seemingly acting insane; "Men can have babies", up is down, war is peace sort of Orwellian non sense, which literally to many, makes no sense at all. The Largest Solar Farm in the USA



The Ute Mountain Ute Tribe's reservation lands will be home to an eight mile by one mile wide 2.2 million solar panel farm south of Towaoc Colorado. Canigou group, an international renewable energy company, will be developing what is called, the Sun Bear Solar Farm. As with all renewable energy 'farms', there will be an initial benefit of bringing hundreds of jobs to the area. Construction will begin later this year, going live by 2026 if all goes on schedule. The company's website states it will produce 975mwp, megawatts of AC per year, to be connected to the grid, with an investment of \$1.5 billion in southwest Colorado.

As reported by KSJD, "Canigou Group's director, Justin Passfield, said the project will cost over \$1 billion. Passfield said electricity generated from the solar farm will connect to the Western Area Power Administration (WAPA) power line. Still, it's unclear what regional entities Canigou

will sell the electricity to."

Though unclear how much of the power will remain local, or move out through the lines, the company states this project would be capable of powering more than 250,000 homes during peak generation. As SW Colorado land is relatively less expensive for purchase or leases, and it is estimated to have about 300 days of sunshine per year, we are well situated to being attractive to solar power generating facilities being installed in our region.

EDUCATION AND THE WORK FORCE

SWCO Ed Collaborative is a relatively new non profit in our region, who's goal as stated on their website is as follows: "The Southwest Colorado Education Collaborative strengthens diverse communities by providing pathways in career readiness and higher education for students to build 21st-century skills and economically viable futures."

Founding Executive Director Jessica Morrison, told the Pinto Bean,

"we help support our high school students... to think about what type of careers are out there, and then access those type of careers while they are in Middle School and High School, so that they feel like they have a stronger understanding of where they would like their future to go by the time they are graduating high school."

There are several ways the collaborative works with educational institutions and industry leaders for both the benefit of the students and area companies and agencies. Working with school counselors, they help provide "career exposure" for students through coordinating job shadowing and advising on opportunities. In working with industry, they build "half day interactive hands/ brains on activities" to demonstrate the career, and allow students to determine an interest level. From the feedback data, the collaborative can then assist further by providing additional pathway options.

SWCOEd works with the higher educational organizations in our region, to address the data collected and respond with appropriate continuing education suggested degrees or certifications programs.

They also offer three types of summer institutes; one that focuses on the very needed skill sets of HVAC, Plumbing and Electrical work, called "Behind the Drywall". Another program is for Environmental pathways, as well as a Health field related program. All programs are free to the students, while the summer institutes also provide a stipend to each participant.

Most recently, they are developing an online application for students, schools, employers/community partners, to connect with each other, called "Career Launch SW", it is a key initiative launched in 2024 by the Collaborative as a platform for connecting business and other organizations, who are invested in providing WBL (work based learning) opportunities to students and young people across the region."

Always interested in a brighter future, the efforts by this non profit only come to fruition by the contributions of everyone involved. YOU GOT LAND?

"This land is your land, this land is my land" is a catchy song written in 1940 by Woodie Guthrie, who was pro-communist and antiprivate land ownership. That view was contrary to how this new country was established, yet the song was popular by many, thinking it was a patriotic song, not realizing it was intended to promote socialistic collectivism on common land. Today, we are seeing a resurgence of that philosophy which started in 1994 with the "Earth Summit", laying out the plan for concentrating populations of people in "sustainable" cities, leaving the open lands in naturally sustained "wildland" conditions. After the un-civil war, new States were being formed from new Territory. The western side has remained in predominately a federal government "State" that owns and controls 70+% of land, watersheds and minerals, economic limiting private wealth development and stewardship to meet the of developing needs the "County Communities".

Recently, a proposal to establish a Federal National Monument on the Lower Dolores which River Canyon, would restrict/eliminate, in perpetuity, local Community/county's from having control for beneficial use and economic wealth development of the open territorial land within their own Counties, without consultation and agreement of the Peoples. Is this not a "Taking" of lands and resources from the Community of People? Land and Water are two of the most important resources ALL people need to exist and survive. If there were no water in the canyon, would this "monument" proposed? Colorado River water issues are paramount today, is there a connection?


Locals Push Back against Legislating our Public Lands

In February, concerned citizens filled a gymnasium in Naturita to hear various points of views on the efforts to designate around 70,000 acres shown on the proposed map at right, as a National Monument through the Antiquities Act. Addressing the local concerns about the Dolores River Corridors, an online petition is available, stating it was " born out of a deeply personal concern for the residents of Gateway, Paradox, Bedrock, Nucla and Naturita in Colorado. The proposed designation of the Dolores River as a National Monument threatens to impose severe economic hardships communities. We are not just bystanders; we are people whose livelihoods and way of life stand to be disrupted.

The monument designation would lead to an immediate cessation of mining activities that many local families depend on for their income. It would also put an end to hunting and cattle grazing - practices that have been part of our heritage for generations. Our freedom to enjoy motorized travel and outdoor activities in these lands will be curtailed.


Moreover, this decision has been made without giving those most affected a chance to voice their opposition. The proponents have attempted to push this through without adequate public discussion or transparency.

This is not just about preserving nature; it's about preserving our rights as residents and stakeholders in these lands. We believe in conservation but it should not come at the expense of local economies or traditions."



The Fenceline wrote that "The monument movement is based on a poll conducted via phone interviews and text-to-web surveys among 750 active registered voters, only 450 of whom are located in the five local area counties of Dolores, Mesa, Montezuma, Montrose and San Miguel counties. A petition to move forward with the monument has received 2,631 signatures." As of printing, the petition against it has rasied close to 2300 signatures.







"We urge you all - especially those from Colorado - to join us in opposing this monument designation until proper consultations are held with all relevant parties involved. Stand with us today by signing this petition against the unilateral imposition that threatens our way of life." The QR code takes you to the petition page.





MONTICELLO UTAH

Many rural towns that developed around busy highways, struggle with safety concerns as cars and semi trucks tend to pass through small towns at high speeds. Stoplights, speed signs, and police monitoring and ticketing are some options to help. In Monticello, the City Council discussed some options. City Manager Kulow provided some suggestions from Department of Transportation (UDOT), to install flashing radar speed limit signs East of town on Highway 491. Another proposal was from the Monticello Lions Club to "place two sets of bright orange flags on either side of Main Street at the intersections of 100 South and 200 South for pedestrians to carry while crossing the street. The mounts would need to be placed on breakaway poles near the intersection. The project would require two flag sets at \$200 each, with the Lions Club sharing a financial commitment to the project as well as volunteer labor for the project." as reported in the San Juan Record. No immediate action was taken, however Mayor Bayley Hedglin added, "I don't mind being known as a speed trap town, that's a good reputation to have."



MOAB UTAH

The Moab Sun News reported "New LED lighting retrofits have been installed between 200 and 300 South on Moab's Main Street to begin the process of bringing the lighting into compliance with new outdoor lighting ordinances. The public is invited to weigh in on two different types of bulbs: fixtures in the north section of the block contain 3000K LED lighting units, and the four lights in the south section are 2400K. The public is asked to provide feedback to the city by March 20 by emailing sustainability@moabcity.org."

Be sure to reserach the effects of LED lighting and various frequencies being used, that may be detrimental to humans having high exposure to the lighting.

RICO CO

The Town is holding a community forum, on the Town Wide Lead Soils Clean Up Program to address improvements of the Columbia Tailings/Gazebo Property site. March 7, 6pm, at the Town Hall and also on Zoom. The Town is also looking at a potential water rate increase along with amending the water regulations.

COLORADO

Colorado's wildlife specialists are nearly finished with updates to a plan that could return a carnivorous mammal to the Centennial State.

Aside from the first five letters of their name, wolverines have little in common with wolves, the species that draws the majority of headlines for wildlife management. One thing they do have in common is that they were once prolific in the West

Jared Polis included it in his 2024-2025 budget letter, which serves as a request to the legislature and outlines priorities for the coming year. The request noted funding for biodiversity. In recent years, Colorado chose to revisit a plan from 2010 that outlines how North American wolverines could be reintroduced to the state, similar to an earlier effort that brought lynx back.

The US Supreme Court unanimously struck down a Colorado Supreme Court ruling, aiming to disqualify Pres. Donald Trump from being listed on the state GOP primary. The Colorado Primary ballots will be counted on March 5th.

What is a "Dog King"?

Found within the annals of Nordic history, three separate tales of canine kings emerge from Sweden, Norway and Denmark. "All three were put in place by an over-king, over a people he had just conquered, usually as an insult." Such was the case of a Horse named Incitatus installed in the court of Caesar Caligula.

There were twelve Caesars (121 AD), Caligula planned to make Incitatus a consul, and the horse would "invite" dignitaries to dine with him in a house outfitted with servants there to entertain such events. Suetonius also wrote that the horse had a stable of marble, with an ivory manger, purple blankets and a collar of precious stones. The horse was attended by servants and was fed oats mixed with gold flake and that Caligula made the horse a priest. Also, the lurid nature of the story added spice to their narratives and won him additional followers. Scholars suggest that the treatment of Incitatus by Caligula was an elaborate prank intended to ridicule and provoke the Senate, rather than a sign of insanity, or was perhaps a form of satire with the implication that a horse could perform a senator's duties.

Modern Farmer.com writes that Danish text tells the story of Rakke the Old Danish word for dog, a canine king appointed to rule over the Danes by the Swedish over-king Adils.

No doubt there have been many tales of people put in positions of 'power' that were actually puppets, being played by greater powers behind the 'throwns'.



And as a Dog King note, we may just have one in the White House today, as our current President in residence is being mocked on comedy shows all over the world (use the QR code). NACHO REGULAR CHEESE DIP

A little food trivia... did you know that the chemical sign for the element that makes the creamy cheese you pour over corn chips to make Nachos, is sodium citrate, whose chemical formula is Na3C6H5O7 or NACHO!

The Cleveland Clinic stated, "Sodium citrate and citric acid combine in an oral solution to prevent kidney stones and metabolic acidosis. This solution works by making your blood and pee less acidic. You can mix this solution with 6 ounces of water before drinking it as directed."

So many of the store bought nacho cheese goo seems to be made of melted plastic, actually checking the ingredient list, many start with whey, and then go way down the list of other oils and additives including msg. Look at fondue, that molten pot of cheese mix that was popular in the 70s in the US, and a stapel of many northern climate countries like Norway. To keep the cheese from separating out the oil, a fondue will use a splash of wine and or lemon juice, as the tartaric acid and citric acid, function as emulsifying components, allowing for the cohesive melt.

For Nacho cheese dips with a desire for a hearty cheddar taste, just how do you make your own creamy molten cheese that doesn't separate the fat out of the proteins? Enter Sodium Citrate as that same type of emulsifier. It actually is the element in those processed cheeses like a velveta. A 4% ratio to the total weight of the cheese you use, with some liquid element, will result in a nice melty dipping sauce.

CORNED BEEF

Corned beef and cabbage - it's everywhere in March. Is it really an "Irish" concoction? Irish cattle were used for working the fields, for milk and dairy products. Thus the famous Irish butter. The British were invaded by the Roman armies who brought their beef eating culture with them, so that British culture expanded to identify the roast beef as a symbol of aristocracy and middle class food. They outsourced cattle from neighboring Scotland and Ireland, and eventually North America to meet the growing need.

The "Cattle Acts of 1663 and 1667", prohibited the export of live cattle to England, which resulted in on the hoof cattle flooding the market and lowering the cost, ripening the times for the corned beef product. The name comes from using large corn kernel sized salt crystals to cure the meat. Ireland's salt tax was much less than England, and so Ireland became a hub for salt and corned beef. Enter further naval wars, and a supply of protein using the dried cured beef became a staple. Zoom forward to WWI and you'll see the first appearance of S.O.S. - S#!* on a Shingle recipe in the 1910 Manual for Army Cooks, creamed chipped beef on toast - evolving to biscuits and gravy in other places. No matter how you like your corned beef, it's a savory way to enjoy beef protein, and we are lucky to have it!
