#### Heavy Run Off High DOFLO

High early runoff is still filling McPhee at a rate of more than 1 ft/day. McPhee has reached a water surface elevation of 6916.9 feet, leaving only about 30,000 acre-feet of storage remaining until full. Releases from McPhee are still increasing in response to high early runoff.

McPhee started releasing approximately 2,800 CFS, as it ramps up to reach 3,400 CFS by May 5th. Releases are expected to remain at 3,400 CFS through the second week of May. Check online for most recent update as they may grow. As always, there is uncertainty in the forecasted inflows; if the reservoir rises faster than current predictions, there is the possibility that releases will increase to control reservoir elevation. possibly to around 4,000 CFS. With the reservoir approaching full, operators must balance outflows with inflows to minimize reservoir gains, and so lose some discretion in regards to release rates. This is especially true this year, when low snowmelt has filled the reservoir weeks earlier than predicted. If recreating on the river, be aware that releases below McPhee can change at any time, though operators will endeavor to minimize unannounced changes.

For planning purposes at this stage, raftable flows (1,200 CFS or more) are expected to continue through Memorial Day weekend. Be aware, this is just a forecast, and the true length and volume of the spill remain unknown. The first half of the spill will have more certainty than the second half.

# Town of Dove Creek's Cleanup Day!

The Town of Dove Creek is offering two Cleanup Days for Town Residents Only. The first will be on Sat. June 3rd, with a second on July 22nd. The dumpsters will be open from 8am to 4pm or until they are filled up on each day. The Limb Pile will also be open just on those two dedicated days, both located at the Town barn at 505 W. 4th Street. Certain items will NOT be accepted, including: tires, inner tubes, or other large rubber items, batteries or any item containing acid, oil or anything soaked with oil, soil, any substance considered as hazardous materials. Scrap Metal will be accepted on the West side of the Town Yard - that includes: all metal, appliances, hot water heaters, microwaves (without the glass tray), refrigerators and freezers (IF they do NOT have freon) and tire rims but no rubber).





#### SOLAR POWER

Lots going on with Solar Power. The Colorado Legislature recently passed HB-1234, which establishes the Streamlined Solar Permitting and Inspection Grant Program and provides nearly \$1 million to help local governments with start-up costs associated with adopting permitting and inspection software.

From PV magazine, they reported "Last year the Department of Energy (DOE) released a solar guidebook that encourages local governments to adopt SolarAPP+ (Solar Automated Permit Process), a software developed by the Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) and UL Solutions, that can immediately approve residential permits. According to NREL, projects submitted through the app are 37% less likely to fail final inspections than projects that don't use the tool. At present, 32 communities across the U.S. are using SolarAPP+, resulting in over 15,000 residential solar permits issued, accounting for 100,000 kW of electricity and 15,000 estimated staff hours saved on reviewing permits." This is more applicable to counties where extensive building permits are required. As Colorado is said to offer more than 300



days of sunshine a year that makes for great solar energy potential (though that must be an average as our '23 winter provided a lot of cloud coverage). They reported, "Currently the state has about 2 GW of solar resources installed, according to the Solar Energy Industries Association, and is ranked 13th in the nation for solar. Streamlining the solar permitting and inspection process can help more Coloradans speed up the process of harnessing that sunshine."

Locally, Empire Electric (EEA) offers interconnectivity to the distribution grid aka grid tied, for solar installations. They state, "The concept behind a residential solar PV system is that using the sun's energy reduces the use of non-renewable sources providing an environmental benefit. This serves two purposes; first, your home can receive power when there isn't enough sunlight to generate electricity (cloudy days and at night) and second, you can support the sale of excess solar energy to the utility. This is called net metering."

From solar well pumps, to small shed power, from phone solar chargers, to solar tied to the grid, or full off the grid solar with battery bank, solar power is making its way into everyone's lives. Do your own research to see if some solar panels might be a good idea for your future.

#### Land Development in Rico

Durango Telegraph reported on the large property in Rico that was slated for development, and where things stand with regard to Atlantic Richfield. "Rico still may get gentrified, but the threat of it becoming a glitzy destination resort appears to have subsided. On April 5, the Dolores County clerk recorded a real property transfer and a special warranty deed conveying dozens of Disposition Properties' parcels to Atlantic Richfield. While the property transfer remains under wraps – it's labeled "sensitive" – the warranty deed includes a list of what appears to be all of Disposition's remaining properties. The transfer fee is listed as \$778.94, indicating that the sale price was about \$7.79 million." The reporter stated,

"I wasn't able to get in touch with anyone at Atlantic Richfield – now the valley's largest landowner – about the purchase. I can rest assured, however, that they aren't going to be building a Rico Mountain mega-resort. Rico Town Manager Chauncey McCarthy said the mining company likely will hold onto contaminated and mining-impacted claims in order to remediate and reclaim them (which is probably why they bought the property in the first place). They may sell off other parcels and have expressed an interest in working with the town to make use of the in-town properties. The Montezuma Land Conservancy reportedly wanted to buy the property and put conservation easements on some parcels while possibly building affordable housing on others. Those kinds of scenarios seem far more likely.

Rico, undoubtedly, will continue to grow. But what that growth looks like and how fast it will occur seems to be far more within the control of the community and its residents." Rico has become a potential bedroom community for Telluride, with little real estate on the market.

### "Climate Smart Commodities" Planning

Rural communities across the world, are no doubt aware of the global attention from international groups such as the WEF, on farmers/ranchers in efforts to reduce so called 'green house gases'. Here in the U.S., efforts by the USDA are initiating pilot programs for monitoring and adjusting farm and ranch practices to align with the globalist objectives.

This year, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) kicked-off the implementation phase for 141 projects funded for 5 years, through the \$3.1 billion Partnerships for Climate-Smart Commodities effort. Project partners are beginning work on formal implementation of the climatesmart production practices, marketing, and quantification, monitoring, reporting and verification of greenhouse gas benefits that are funded through the effort as agreements are finalized on a rolling basis. The Partnerships for Climate-Smart Commodities Learning Network (Partnerships Network), is a collaboration of all the project partners to generate key lessons-learned as projects are implemented.

In Colorado, an example of one of the projects is "Low Carbon Beef USDA Pilot Program: A Fully Integrated Lifecycle Approach to Reduce GHG (green house gas) Emissions from Beef Cattle at Commercial Scale--This project will help to implement climate-smart methods in beef production, reducing GHG emissions and generating carbon credit revenue for producers." This project focuses on the adaptation of Sorghum.

"Farmers, ranchers and forest landowners are on the front lines of climate change. At the same time, they are uniquely positioned to deliver climate solutions through climate-smart production that reduces greenhouse gas emissions and sequesters carbon," said Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack. "Through these projects, our partners are working to create new markets for climate-smart commodities, while developing the tools needed to quantify impacts and help producers implement climate-smart practices on their land. We're excited these projects are getting underway and look forward to achieving meaningful results for producers, agriculture and forestry economies and our climate." Memorial Day weekend officially kicks off the outdoor grilling season, cooking up everything from your basic burger or steak, to kebabs or ribs, and chicken done in many ways, or delicious grilled veggies as the main dish. The sides often get thrown together or are just boring. Then I found the Jalapeño popper potato salad!



For a 4-6 serving size, boil 3 pounds of russet potato about 5-6 taters cut into 1" squares or red potato equivalent, boil about 15 min. or until tender. Slightly smash the potatoes in a bowl with the cream and cheddar cheeses. Leave some chunks. Cook your bacon drain and crumble. Add salt, ranch, jalapeños and some of the pickled brine if you are using pickled peppers, mustard to taste, pepper, hard boiled eggs, scallions and gherkin pickle pieces. Use the gherkin brine if you use regular fresh jalapeños. Fold it gently altogether. Can be served as a warm side or cold. For best presentation, hit the top with more bacon and green onions.



#### Input for CPW on SWA - State Wildlife Areas

Colorado Parks and Wildlife is seeking public input on proposed regulation changes for State Wildlife Areas, they manage about 350 State Wildlife Areas (SWAs) across the state, which are properties held to benefit wildlife populations or provide opportunities for wildlife-related recreation. To help ensure SWAs are benefitting wildlife and manage increasing recreation demand at SWAs, CPW is proposing updates to SWA regulations and is seeking public input on the proposed changes.

SWA visitors are encouraged to learn more about the proposed changes to general SWA regulations and property-specific changes. The public can learn more and provide feedback on https://engagecpw.org/ through Wed., May 24, 2023. CPW is looking for specific feedback regarding its general provision and property-specific changes. The proposed regulations are tentatively scheduled to be discussed at the May Parks and Wildlife Commission meeting before final consideration and possible adoption at the June PWC meeting.

The San Juan National Forest began selling permits for personal-use firewood cutting and other miscellaneous products on May 1st. Many forest roads are covered by more snow than in recent years, leading to a delay in re-opening the roads, so please contact your local ranger district for the latest road conditions or visit the webpage www.fs.usda.gov/sanjuan Visitors are asked to stay off wet roads and respect road closures, which will prevent long-term and costly damages to the roadway. Purchase your permit and know the rules before you head into the woods.



Each permit costs \$20 and allows firewood cutters to gather two-and-a-half cords of dead and downed firewood from the San Juan National Forest for personal use prior to December 31. Each household may purchase additional permits for up to 10 cords of firewood per year for personal use. A cord is the amount of tightly piled wood in a stack four-feet high by four-feet wide by eight-feet long. Permits are available for purchase at Dolores Outfitters 341 Railroad Ave in Dolores.
