




## **2023 PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS**

In accordance with the Archdiocese Uniform Parish Regulations (UPR) the Parish Council has established a Church Usage Fee and guidelines to clarify the eligibility of **Members** and **Stewards** requesting the celebration of the Sacraments or the Rite of Burial at this Parish. These services may be requested by **Members** of other Orthodox Parishes and are subject to a different fee schedule. These definitions and the Church Usage Fee go into effect as of **January 1, 2024**.

### **MEMBER**

In accordance with the UPR a member of the Annunciation Parish or any other Orthodox Parish, is anyone 21 years old or older who been Baptized and or Chrismated according to the Sacraments of the Orthodox Faith. If married, in the Orthodox Church, and is subsequently divorced and has received a Church divorce according the procedure of the Orthodox Faith.

### **STEWARD**

A Steward is a member, as defined above, either single or married, who has filled out and submitted the Time & Talent sheet and Financial Pledge Card for the current year and remains current until such time as the Financial Pledge is fulfilled. As a Steward of this Parish there is **NO** set fee for the Sacraments of Baptism, Chrismation, Wedding or for the Rite of Burial. Honorariums may be required for the services as outlined below.

### **CHURCH USAGE FEE**

If a member or a member acting as a Sponsor is **NOT** a Steward at the time that the Sacraments of Baptism, Chrismation, Wedding or the Rite of Burial is scheduled with the Parish Priest, the member is required to pay, within the appropriate timeframe as determined by the Parish Priest, the Church Usage Fee of **\$800.00** to the Parish. The member is also required to pay an Honorarium, as determined by the Priest, to the Priest and the Chanter. The Parish Council has authorized the Parish Priest to approve any deviations from the fees outlined above.

# **SACRAMENTAL DATES FOR 2024**

According to the Orthodox Faith and our Holy Greek Orthodox Church the following information is to be used for the proper scheduling of Sacraments within our Holy Orthodox Church. These days are to be followed and adhered to by the Clergy and our laity. A Sacrament can be conducted on one of the non-permissible days only if absolutely necessary and then only by special permission of our Metropolitan.

# **ADULT CHRISMATIONS**

Chrismations may take place on any day of the week throughout the year (except Good Friday). A Chrismation will take place only after proper instruction with the Parish Priest and discussion of the appropriate day and time for the Chrismation.

# **BAPTISM**

Baptisms <u>CANNOT BE CONDUCTED</u> on the following days:

Eve of Epiphany & Epiphant - January 5 & 6

Great Lent - March 18 - April 27 (allowed but discouraged)

Holy Week - April 28 - May 4

PASCHA - May 5

Falling Asleep of Theotokos Fast - August 1 - 14 (allowed but discouraged)

Feast of Falling Asleep of Theotokos - August 15

Christmas Fast - November 15 - December 11 (allowed but discouraged)

Christmas Fast - December 12 - 24

Christmas Day - December 25

### **WEDDINGS**

Weddings <u>CANNOT BE CONDUCTED</u> on the following days:

Eve of Epiphany & Epiphany - January 5 & 6

Great Lent - March 18 - April 27

Holy Week - April 28 - May 4

PASCHA - May 5

Falling Asleep of Theotokos Fast - August 1 - 14

Feast of Falling Asleep of Theotokos - August 15

Beheading of St. John the Baptist - August 29

Exaltation of the Holy Cross - September 14

Christmas Fast - November 15 - December 11 (allowed but discouraged)

Christmas Fast - December 12 - 24

Christmas Day - December 25

MEMORIALS: Cannot be held on the following Sundays: Apr.28, May 5, 12, June 23

**FUNERALS** Although a *Funeral is NOT a Sacrament* but a prayer service, they are permitted on any day of the week throughout the year <u>except on Sundays and Good Friday.</u> There is no exception to this rule.

### 2024 HOUSE BLESSING INFORMATION

The Feast of Epiphany (January 6<sup>th</sup>) is one of the many joyous Holy Days in the Orthodox Church. The Holy Epiphany commemorates the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ in the waters of the Jordan River. Woven within the traditions of the Orthodox celebration of the Feast is the blessing of the homes of the faithful. The purpose of blessing homes is to show our acceptance of God's sanctification and to reveal the home as what it was created by God to be: a way to His Kingdom. It also shows that the "church in the home", the family, is a reflection of the Church. This year Fr. Dean will be blessings from Jan. 8<sup>th</sup> thru Jan. 31<sup>st</sup>.

Listed below are the days and times Fr. Dean will be able to bless your home. Please complete the form below and return it to the Church Office or to Fr. Dean personally **NO LATER THAN JANUARY 4<sup>TH</sup>.** Please be flexible with your schedule on that day. You will be notified a day or two before the approximate time of Father's visit. If you are unable to be home for Father's visit because of conflicts or illness, please call the Church Office and reschedule.

When Fr. Dean comes to your home, the following should be observed:

- 1. Have as many family members there as possible.
- 2. Set a place either in the dining room or kitchen with the following items:
  - A. An Icon
  - B. A medium sized bowl with water filled a quarter way in it
  - C. A white dish towel
  - D. A candle
  - E. Incense (optional)
- 3. Print the FIRST NAMES of all family members on a sheet of paper.
- 4. Please remember that since Fr. Dean will be making many visitations, DON'T FEED THE PRIEST.
- 5. PLEASE TURN ALL LIGHTS ON IN THE ROOMS TO BE BLESSED.

### STEWARDSHIP GUIDELINES

The following <u>Stewardship Guidelines</u> have been established to define a <u>Steward in good standing</u> within our Annunciation Greek Orthodox Parish.

### 1) CANONICAL & SPIRITUAL GOOD STANDING:

- **a)** Any member who has been baptized into the Orthodox Faith or has entered the Orthodox Faith through Chrismation.
- **b)** Any member, if married, <u>must</u> have been married within a Canonical Orthodox Church. If only married civilly, he/she is not in good standing and therefore, cannot become a Steward of this Parish.
- c) A member must participate in the worship services of this Parish on a regular basis and partake of the Holy Sacraments (Holy Confession & Holy Communion) on a regular basis. Must keep the rules and fasts, to train and teach the young according to the faith and spirit of Orthodoxy, to respect the Clergy, the ecclesiastical authority, and all governing bodies of the Church, to be obedient in matters of faith and ecclesiastical order, and to cooperate in every way towards the welfare and prosperity of the Parish and the success of its sacred mission and ministries.

### 2) FINANCIAL GOOD STANDING:

- a) Any member, over 18 years of age (except a full-time student), who turns in a Stewardship Pledge Card within the current calendar year (Jan. 1 Dec. 31) is considered a Steward.
- **b)** A Steward is eligible to vote at any regular or special General Assembly Meeting or at the Election of Parish Council if he/she is current with his/her financial Stewardship Pledge.
- c) A Steward who wishes to vote at a Regular or Special General Assembly Meeting or at the Election of Parish Council and is present on that day, has until the commencement of the Meeting or Election of the Parish Council to become current in his/her financial Stewardship Pledge.
- d) A Member MUST fill out, sign and send in a Financial Stewardship Pledge Card in order to be considered a Steward of this Parish. A member who only sends in money without first filling out, signing and sending in a Financial Pledge Card will not be considered a Steward and the money will not be credited towards his/her Financial Stewardship Pledge.

A Steward is considered in good standing if he/she meets the Canonical, Spiritual and Financial applicable requirements as stated above. The Canonical and Spiritual requirements must be verified by the **Priest**. The Financial requirements must be verified by the **Priest and the Parish Council Treasurer**.

# **HAPPY NEW YEAR!**

So here we are, at the dawn of 2024. I wonder how we'll do this year. Will be even more busy? Will we try to make better use of our time? There is a passage of scripture that I believe can be of help to us as we look forward to the year ahead. The passage is Ephesians 5:15 – 17 and here is what it says: "See then that you walk cautiously, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is." I think that in this passage St. Paul presents some important lessons that we need to consider.

First of all, we must be very careful how we live because our time on this earth is limited. In Psalm 90:10 we read, "The days of our lives are seventy years; And if by reason of strength they are eighty years, for it is soon cut off, and we fly away." Now, I realize that for some of you younger readers, 70 or 80 years sounds like a long, long time. In fact, I can remember when I thought anyone over 40 was ancient. But no longer, it is all rather relative, isn't it? I also know neither you nor I have a guarantee of adding even one day more to our lives. Scripture tells us not to count on tomorrow because tomorrow may not come for you or for me. All we have is right now.

St. Paul tells us that we must make "the most of every opportunity." And he gives us a reason, "because the days are evil." The mistake that you and I make almost every day is that we get caught up in the here and now and we fail to deal with the eternal, the things that will last forever and ever. We have become "overloaded" by going here and there. As a result, we soon begin only bumping into ourselves coming and going because we have overloaded our lives in the area of commitments.

St. Paul tells us," ...do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is." What do you think the Lord's will is for you in this new year? Do you think He wants your mind so saturated with worries and anxieties that you can't think spiritual thoughts? Do you think He wants your calendar so crowded that you don't have time for the important things? What do you think he Lord's will be for you this year?

First of all, establish your priorities. Hopefully, you believe the Lord should be a part of your life. When you begin to establish priorities, who have to decide just where He stands in your life. So ask yourself, "Who or what is most important in my life? Of course, I'm hoping that your answer will be, "My relationship with Christ, is most important to me." If so, then put that at the top of your list of priorities and say, "This will affect my decisions, my scheduling, my relationship with others, and my whole outlook on life. "Therefore, when Sunday Liturgy rolls around neither rain nor shine nor football will interfere with my being in Liturgy, because He comes first in my life. I'll worship the Lord and nothing will interfere with that."

You need to schedule definite time each day to pray and to read the Scriptures. Pray for yourself, pray for your family and pray for people around you. Pray for the Parish, your Priest and for the Ministries. Never underestimate the power of your prayers for others. Through your prayers you will be a blessing to others, and you'll be blessed as you grow in your faith and trust I the Lord!

You must spend time with your wife and children. Spend time with your wife so the two of you can just talk without any interruptions. Spend time with your children, they're growing up ever so fast. Make sure that you spend quality time with your children. Make sure that your family is very high on the list.

Finally, and most importantly, learn how to live today. The two greatest enemies of time are regrets for things we did in the past, and anxiety about what will happen to us in the future. Many of us are living either in the past or in the future.

Life is what happens to you while you're making plans to do something else. True, isn't it? Another year has come and gone. A new year stretches before us. Help us Lord, to redeem the time. Help us to use the 8,760 hours of this year the wisest way we can for You, and for Your glory.

# JANUARY 6TH EPIPHANY DAY

This Feast Day is one of the greatest days of the Christian year. It ranks in importance with Christmas and Easter. In many parts of the world, this Feast Day is celebrated with even greater solemnity than Christmas itself. In English, we are accustomed to hearing this Feast Day called "Epiphany" a word which mean "manifestation" or "appearance." On this day, the Orthodox Church celebrates the Baptism of Jesus Christ in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist (he is called "the Baptist" because he baptized Christ.) Epiphany day is also called "Theophany" which means "God shows himself to us." The importance of this Feast Day lies int he fact that for the first time the Holy Trinity was revealed for all mankind to know and believe, (the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit). When Jesus Christ was baptized in the River Jordan, a voice was heard from the heavens above saying, "This is my Son in whom I am well pleased." The Father whose voice was heard from the heavens was God. The white dove was the symbol of the Holy Spirit which descended upon Jesus Christ, the Son of God Thus, we have the Holy Trinity being revealed to all that day, almost 2000 years ago. This is why we call this day the day of *illumination* (light) and *manifestation* (appearance). The Holy Trinity made its appearance, and we have been illiminated by this wonderful truth and blessing. The Greek Orthodox calls this day *Ta Fota*, which means the day of "Lights." On this day we have the traditional blessing of the waters. Since the waters of the Jordan were blessed by the presence of Jesus Christ, it is a source of Divine Grace and blessing and we bless ourselves and our homes with the waters of the "Sanctification Service" which is held every January 5th and 6th.

The service on January 5th is called the Aghiasmos, or Service for Blessing Holy Water. On this day all Holy Water bottles are filled and given to the faithful to use during the year in their home. The service on January 6th is called Megas Aghiasmos, or Great Service for Blessing Holy Water, and the water that is blessed is given to the faithful to drink. The Priest also blesses all Orthodox homes with the sanctified water of the Epiphany Service. In many parts of Greece and in the Southern States of America, the traditional blessing of the waters is observed; and then a cross is thrown into the waters and young men dive into the water to get the cross. This is all part of the celebration of this great Feast Day of our church.

Epiphany Day is a day of illumination and santification. Let us pledge ourselves to a greater participation in the sacramental life of the Church of Christ. When the Priest blesses our homes, let us all pray that the blessing of the Epiphany Season be with us throughout the year and may our homes be sanctified with our prayers, Christian living and spiritual direction in our lifetime.
