A Golden Age For Native American Cinema

In a history-making triumph, Lily Gladstone has become the first Indigenous person to win a Golden Globe for best actress for her role in “Killers of the Flower Moon”.

The achievements of Lily Gladstone and the FX series “Reservation Dogs” mark a significant moment in the representation and recognition of Native American talent in the entertainment industry. Gladstone’s historic win as the first Indigenous person to receive a Golden Globe for best actress, and the critical success of “Reservation Dogs,” underscore a broader trend of increasing visibility and acclaim for Native American stories and actors in both film and television.

Moments like this not only show the visibility of Native people and stories in the entertainment industry but give us chance to see ourselves represented in fully fleshed out stories that more accurately show the Native experience.

This modern golden age in cinema and television for Native Americans is characterized by a diverse array of stories and genres. From the intense drama of “Killers of the Flower Moon” to the unique blend of humor and poignancy in “Reservation Dogs,” these productions are showcasing the richness of Native American storytelling.

Other notable contributions like “Prey,” “Dark Winds,” “Blood Quantum,” and “Rutherford Falls” and Disney’s “Echo” further amplify this trend. These films and television series are all part of the growing library of Native cinema that are showcasing our stories. This trend is great for showing general audiences a more authentic representation of Native peoples.



Whether it’s the heartfelt comedy of the rez kids in “Reservation Dogs”, the action adventure of Naru in “Prey” or the socio-political zombie horror of “Blood Quantum” Native cinema is crossing all genres.

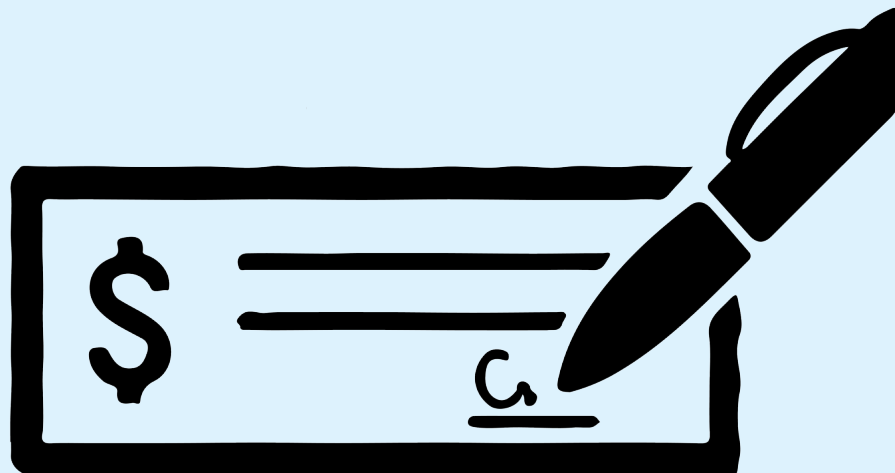

LIHEAP APPLICATIONS OPEN FOR FY 2024

The Member's Assistance Department has opened applications for the **federally** funded Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) for fiscal year 2024. This is a **NEEDS BASED PROGRAM**, with income eligibility requirements.

LIHEAP serves the following counties:

- Manistee
- Mason
- Lake
- Wexford
- Newaygo
- Oceana
- Kent
- Ottawa

Applications **MUST BE COMPLETE** with the following information included with the application submission:

- Copies of Tribal identification, government (state) issued identification, social security card/information.
- List ALL people living in the household, including children.
- A copy of income sources (pay-stubs, Social Security award letters, bank statements, tax statements, per capita payments, unemployment insurance letters, self-employed income statements, retirement/pension statements, earned income of a child under age 18).
- Copies of energy bills, shut off notices, with clear vendor/account information, and any other supporting documentation required by the program.

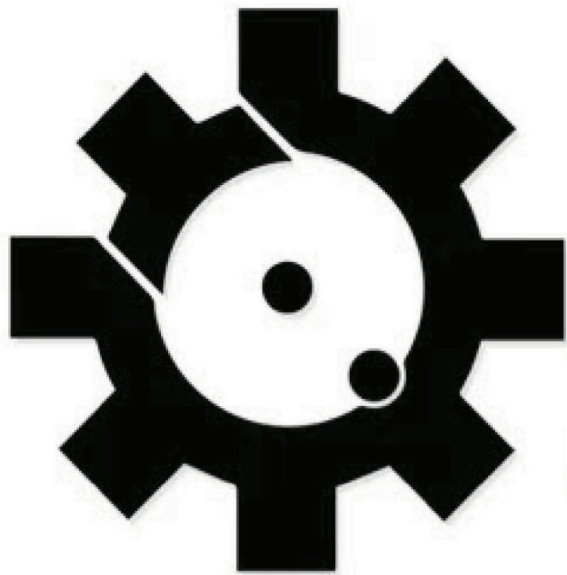
**** Applications will not be processed until all information is provided. ****

Benefit levels for this program are based on the following criteria:

- Income
- Family (household) size
- Home energy cost or need: fuel type, energy burden (% of income spent on home energy)
- Overall Energy need

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance benefits **are not automatic**, and each determination for eligibility is based on the federal program requirements for LIHEAP and applications are processed in accordance with those federal program requirements.

This class will help improve Handgun accuracy & Trigger control using Snap caps, Striker caps & Lasers in conjunction with an elite shooting performance system designed to increase consistency by recording shot by shot analysis. The student will see in real time their subtle hand movements & learn " Proper Grip" "Avoiding Recoil Anticipation" "Trigger Press Movement" "Follow Through" Just to name a few.

3. CPL Certification Class

Successful completion of this class will allow you to apply for a Concealed Carry Permit (CCW). See MI state laws.

4. CPL RENEWAL Certification Class

Successful completion of this 4 hr.class will allow you to re-apply for a Concealed Carry Permit (CCW). See MI state laws.
