As our land is warmed by sultry sunshine and fireflies illuminate the nights, it is time to enjoy delicious sun-ripened tomatoes right off the vine. A ready home grown tomato, firm and plump, is so inviting to all the senses with a grassy-spicy-sweet fragrance and bright pop of color.

These plants, no matter which variety, are prolific producers and

thrive in the Iowa nutrient rich soil. Currently, they are also pretty inexpensive in the stores.

Vine ripe tomatoes are so versatile and add so much flavor to classic canning recipes like basic tomatoes, tomato juice, catsup, stewed tomatoes, and vegetable soup. There are also many delicious options for spaghetti or pizza sauce, and salsa. With so many delectable choices it was difficult to pick a recipe to share with you. I decided to feature this Homemade Salsa because it's easy and you can truly make it your own. Adjust flavors to your taste with whatever fresh herbs or vegetables you've got in your garden. It's also a simple yet impressive choice to make if you're just learning water bath canning. If you are a seasoned canner, use this one for teaching! This is wonderful to have stocked in your pantry for healthy snacking. Jars of salsa also make a great hostess gift. Enjoy!

Homemade Salsa

Yield: 12 pint jars - Ready in 30 minutes

Tip: Wear gloves when chopping jalapeños

Ingredients

30 medium to large tomatoes

4 onions, diced

3 - 6 jalapeños, diced

2 tomatillos

3 diced garlic cloves

5 tablespoons cilantro, chopped

1 cup lemon juice

5 green bell peppers, diced

3 tablespoons salt

4 teaspoons pepper

Prepare tomatoes by soaking tomatoes in boiling water for 2-3 minutes to split and loosen skins. Peel and chop all tomatoes, drain excess juices off in a strainer or colander before adding extra-large bowl. Add the rest of the veggies (except jalapeños) to the bowl.

Once all the vegetables are in the bowl, stir in the lemon juice, garlic cloves, salt and pepper.

Taste to see how you like it. Then begin adding 1-2 chopped hot peppers at a time, tasting after each addition. Keep in mind that as the salsa sits for a while, it will get a little bit hotter.

Bring all ingredients to a boil in large pot & simmer for 15 minutes. Stir often to prevent sticking.

Fill clean pint jars with salsa, leaving about 3/4 inch at the top. Wipe off tops of the jars before putting hot canning lids on. Screw lids tight, then turn back about 1/4 turn.

Process jars in a hot water bath canner for 15 minutes.


