Southside High School's premier newspaper staff are very excited to present you with some of the latest news happening in our school.



Last season under Coach Ben Stewart, the Panthers went 6-5 with a regular-season record of 6-4. We came in second in our region, going 5-1 in the region playing with our only loss in the region coming from a 14-13 loss to Fort Payne. Southside made the playoffs as a two seed in 6a region 8 with a home playoff game against Mountain Brook, but our season ended early with a 45-7 loss against the Spartans.

Head coach, Miles Holcomb took over the program for the second time. The football season kicked off this year at Guntersville with a theme of white out the wildcats. With a final score of 31-14, the Panthers sadly started with a loss. In Week two, the Panthers took on Hokes Bluff with the theme being boot the Bluff with a final score of 28-7. 



COACH DUTTON HISTORY TEACHER


