All Hallows Day, the festival originally consisted of all Saints Day; on November 1st, All Saints Souls Day on November 2nd, then moved onto the evening of Halloween, October 31st, or so called, All Hallows Eve, where and when all kinds of spirits and troubles were to be out for the day; Holiday. The meaning of Halloween has largely been forgotten.

All Saints Day is or was celebrated as a Holiday by the Greeks, Romans, and many other religious churches. In the 7th century; CE, Pope Bonface IV created All Saints Day, which originally was celebrated on May 13th, A century after, Pope Gregory III, moved the Holiday, All Saints Day to November 1^{st,} and then moved the day before on October 31st, The Saintly celebration became known as All Hallows Eve, or even know today as Halloween.

The Tradition originated with Ancient Celtic festival of Samhan when people would light bone fires and wear costumes to scare off spirits and ghosts. In the Middle Ages, during All Saint's Day and Soul's Day, England and Ireland, poor people would visit the houses of richer Families and receive pastries, called soul cakes. They promised to pray for the families' dead relatives, which was known to be called 'Souling" Later on children took over receiving gifts like food and money, The start of trick-or-treating.



Around the 1800's, pumpkins began to symbolize Halloween, carving face into vegetables became a part of Halloween, the reason pumpkins, Jack-o-lanterns, became apart of Halloween was when an Irish myth about a man nicknamed as "Stingy Jack" who ticked the devil.

In the 19th century, Halloween became a Holiday for Americans because of Irish Immigrants.



In the early 20th century, many mischiefs occurred such like, vandalism, physical assault, and it was not uncommon on the Holiday. In 1930's Haunted Houses became a thing, in the U.S. costumes were worn for many centuries on Halloween, but it was not till the 20th century that costumes started to look like what we wore today.

Hug Graduation Requirements and Diplomas!

What is required



To be able to graduate from Hug, it's required for you to have earned 23 credits. The classes that your required to take and complete include English, Math (which must include Algebra 1, Geometry & Algebra 2), Science, American Government, Economics/Financial Literacy, U.S. History, World History/World Geography, PE/HSROTC, Arts/Humanities/CTE, Computer Literacy, Health, World Language, and Electives. You'll also have to take the Nevada Assessments. It is prescribed by the law as a diploma requirement for their respective graduating class. Students are also required to participate in a College and Career Readiness assessment selected by the Nevada State Board of Education. You must take it during junior/11th year.

Diplomas

There are many diplomas offered to WSCD students. Theres the Standard diploma which the students will need to complete a minimum of 23 credits with all requirements left. And students must take the College and Career Readiness assessment and the civics examination that is required by the state. The other type of diploma is the Advanced diploma, which students will need to complete a minimum of 24 credits and all the requirements for a standard diploma. And an additional credit 3 science credit, and an additional credit of math, and a minimum of 3.25 cumulative GPA, including all credits applicable towards graduation. But they also need to take the College and Career Readiness assessment and the civics



examination. The other type of diploma is the College and Career Ready diploma, the students will need to complete a minimum of 24 credits. They will also need to demonstrate 1 proficiency in speaking not less than two languages or have earned not less than two credits in tone or more areas like Advanced Placement Courses, Dual credit courses, or world language courses. The WSCD honors diploma which students will need to have a minimum of 24 credits, and they must earn 3.40 cumulative GPA with no course failures during the last two years. 

The Davis fire estimated to be approximately 5,824 acres started in Davis Creek Regional Park found in Washoe Valley in South of Reno. The Davis fire is a fire that started September 7th, 2024, and has affected many locals in many ways. Many Places have been evacuated due to the fire, many things were damaged and there was recorded a total loss of 14 homes and all schools in Washoe county school district had to be closed due to the hazard air quality (WCSD).

It is important that us as residents should know what is going on with our surroundings and be aware of certain people's situations and how they are affected by The Davis fire. We as a community should help the people affected, United Way of Northern Nevada and the Sierra opened an assistance fund that goes directly to the people affected covering food shelter and financial assistance. We asked some people from our community and their opinions about the Davis fire they were asked do you think the fire caused extreme damage? What do you think about them cancelling all schools? What would you do if a fire started up near you? How would you react? What would you pack in need of evacuation? Do you have any fire equipment in your home? Who would be the first person you would call? And do you think the wildfires are getting worse this year? Their responses:

- They believed it caused a lot of damage in ruining houses and they liked that they cancelled all schools because the smoke was bad.
- Their other answers where "if a fire started up near me I would immediately call for help in situations such as house fires, forest fires, depends of any sort of setting I am at, I will call for assistance such as the fire department or Police Department and the way I would react to this fire is immediately look for any source of fire extinguisher in my area, if not I would dial for assistance for the fire departments.I do not have any sort of fire equipment in my house.
- The first person I would immediately call in this type of situation would definitely be the fire department.
- I believe throughout the years fires are worsening but overall, this year there have been multiple fires, but I believe the past couple of years they have been worse, so no this year has not got worse from previous years

These were the responses of our fellow community members who wish to stay Anonymous. We would like to give a thank you to them for making time out of the day to answer these questions. We would also like to give a thank you to all the fellow firefighters that helped put out the fire, thanks to them the fire didn't get a lot worse than it already was and our community is now safe.



Plane Crash Outside of Sao Paulo, Brazil kills 62 Passengers

Devastating plane crash proving to be fatal kills all 62 people on board. So far all 62 victims have been found but only 35 victims have been identified and the cause of the aircraft disaster is still unknown and currently undergoing investigation.

On August 9th, 2024, at around 1:30 pm the lives of 57 passengers and 4 crew



members were lost in the residence of Vinhedo, Brazil. The residents of the town Vinhedo witnessed the plane crash from their homes with the plane crashing in a backyard of a nearby home in a gated community injuring one resident. In just one minute the plane plummeted 17,000 feet from the air before coming into contact with the ground. Up until 1:21pm the plane was flying according to schedule, that was when it stopped responding to calls. At 1:22 pm it lost all radar contact. French government investigators join the cause to find the origin of the crash as it still goes undetermined. Since the accident the president of Brazil, Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva asked the crowd during an event that Friday to take a minute of silence for the victims of the crash. Investigators are using seat assignments from the aircraft, cell phones, physical belongings or just anything they can find at the scene to help identify the bodies. Families of the victims are urged to share any sort of medical/dental records in hopes to help identify the deceased.

A SCHOOL SHOOTING IN A HIGH SCHOOL IN GEORGIA

A school shooting on September 4^{th, 2024,} in a high school in Georgia at Apalachee High School in Winder, close to Atlanta, a student that attended this school, age 14 open fired and killed four people on Wednesday.

The dead were identified to be two students and two teachers, the two students were to be 14-year-olds, Mason Schermerhorn and Christian Arugula, and two teachers Richard Aspinwall age 39 and Christina Imrie age 53.

The shooter was identified to be Colt Gary, not only did the teenager get charged but also the father. Judge Currie Mingledorff informed Gary, because of his young age. The maximum he could face is life in prison with or without parole. As for the father Colin Gray, Age 54, Mingledorff said that he will face an utmost possible penalty of 180 years in prison. An arrest warrant for Colin Gray states he gave his son a firearm "with knowledge he was a threat to himself and others."

The family's victims of the school shooting were in the small courtroom. All devastated, sad weeping in tears.

On Wednesday's shooting marked the 45th school shooting in 2024 and the deadliest US shooting since March 2023 massacre at the covenant school in Nashville. (https://www.cnn.com/).

Finance

2:55- "When it comes to the economy do you think Americans were better than they were 4 years ago?"

Kamala: Describes her upbringing and does believe that everything has been on a rise, Explains some of her residential policies for our economy

Trump: States that the reason for our economy to be terrible is due to the immigrants that Biden and Kamala have left into this country. Denies the involvement in project 2025.

Commentator tells trump that there will be a time in the debate to talk about Immigration & gives him a minute to respond.

Abortion

15:40- "Vice President Kamala Harris says that women shouldn't trust you on the issue of abortion because you've changed your position so many times?"
