Peebles Cross Country

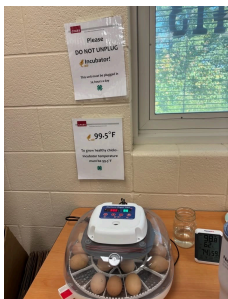

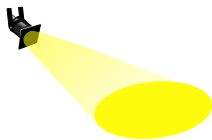
